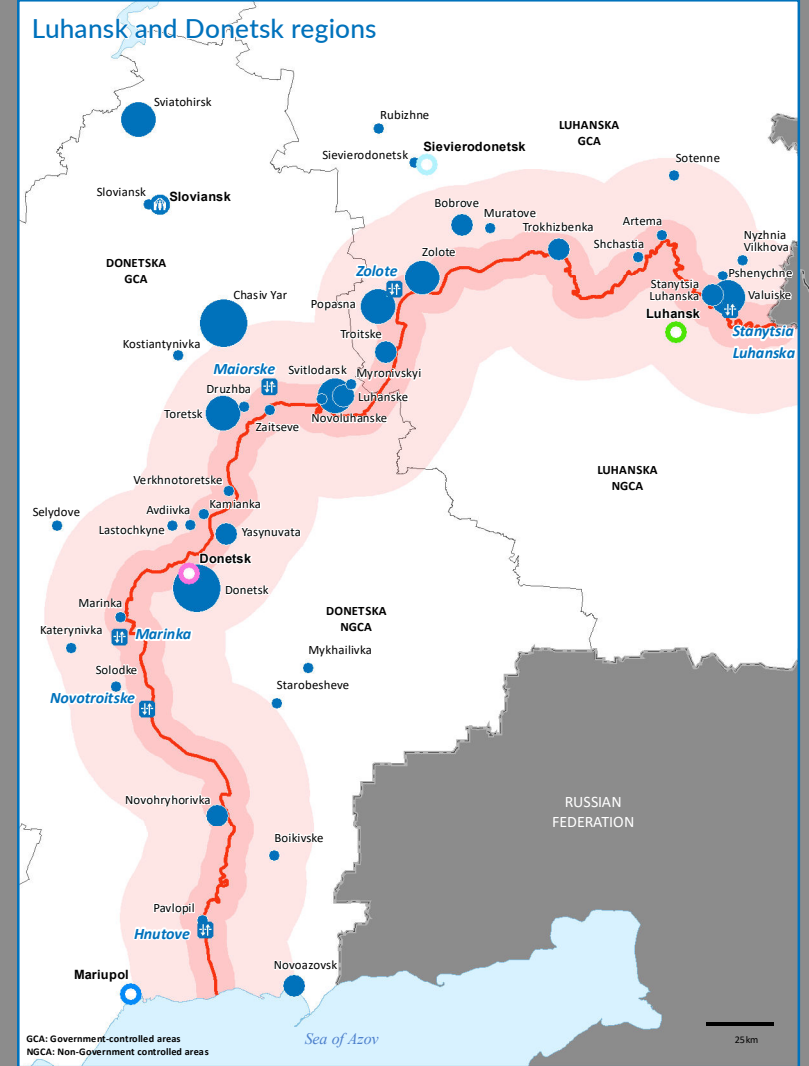
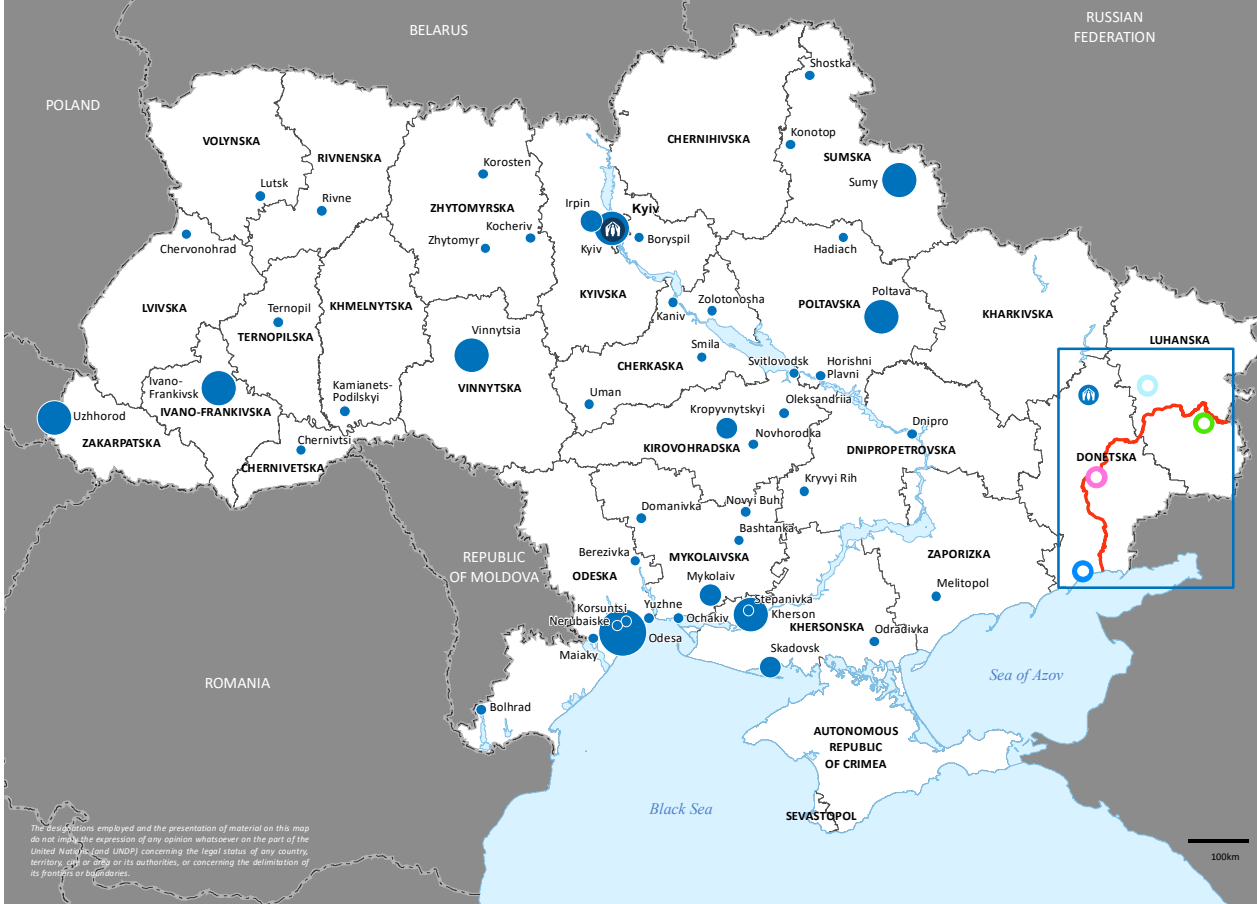


















150 Communities supported throughout Ukraine in 90 settlements in 2019
