

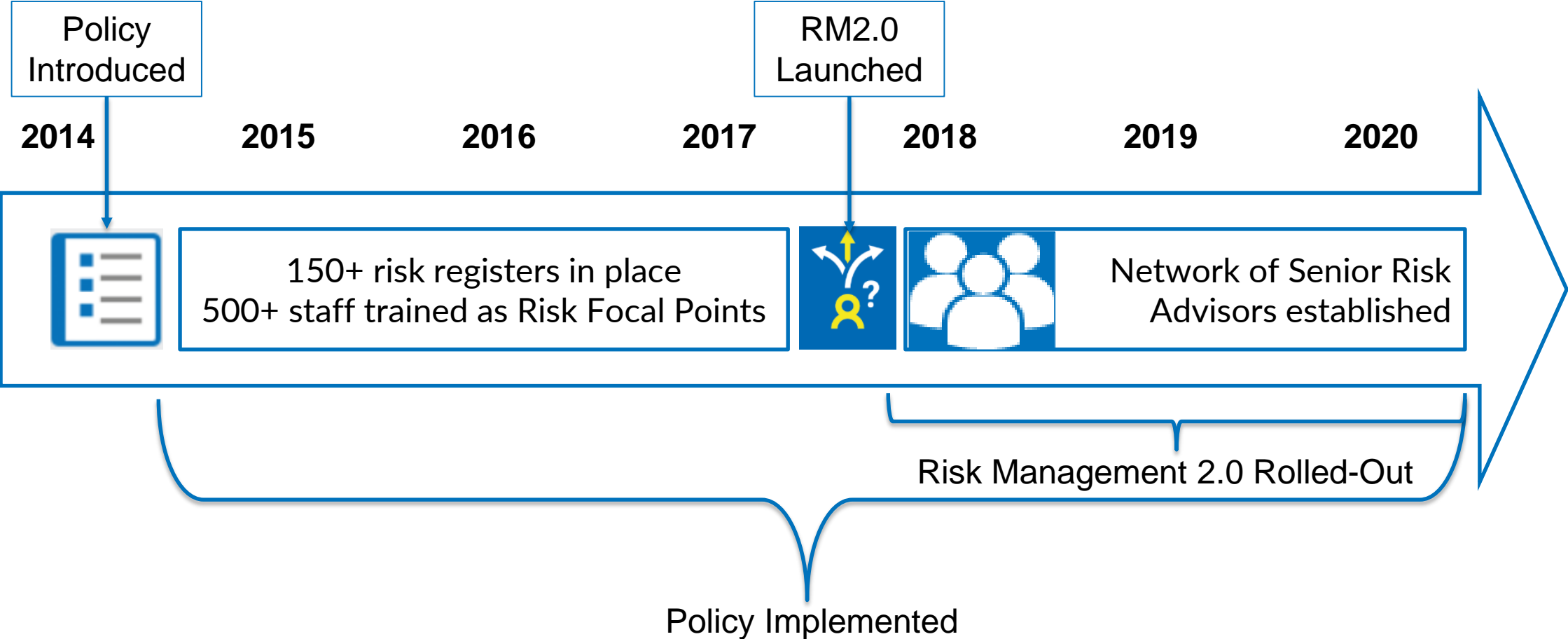

UNHCR's Risk Management Journey



Assessment of UNHCR risk maturity

- April 2019: HLCCM endorsed a Reference Maturity Model for Risk Management in the UN System
- August–September 2019: independent maturity assessment against the HLCCM model in UNHCR
- Initial results:
 - ‘UNHCR has an overall well established ERM system’
 - ‘The overall recommendation is to continue the sound course set by RM 2.0’
 - ‘Opportunities for further improvements exist’

Strong risk management culture in all operational and management areas



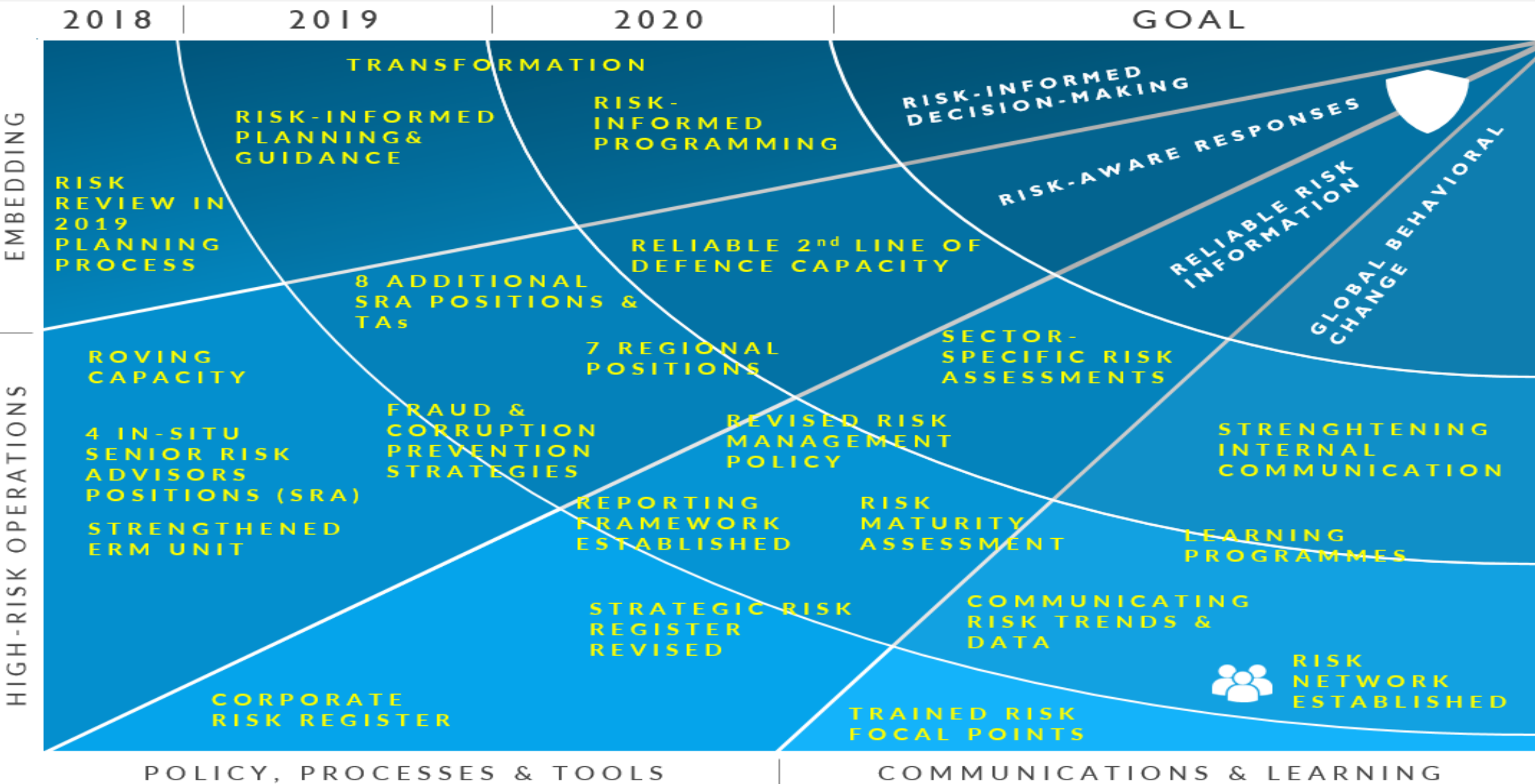

16 cross-cutting risks to UNHCR's high-level protection and solutions objectives

RISK THEME	STRATEGIC RISK
Integrity, accountability and ethical conduct	1. Failure to ensure strong organization-wide integrity and ethical conduct
	2. Insufficient managerial accountability
Strategic partnerships (GCR including CRRF)	3. Inability to effectively implement our role in the Global Compact on Refugees, including the CRRF
Change process	4. Inability to change the organization in a coherent and timely manner, serving affected populations, with buy-in from all levels of staff
Emergency preparedness & response	5. Inadequate response to emergencies with a long-term solution focus
Integrity and quality of information on persons of concern	6. Lack of timely, coherent and accurate data to inform decision making
Funding	7. Inability to build a more secure funding environment for UNHCR
Protection environment & protection role	8. Inability to maintain an authoritative voice and access to governments on refugee, internally displaced and statelessness issues
	9. Failure to effectively communicate protection issues in a polarized global environment
	10. Inability to exercise our mandate effectively in the context of the changing humanitarian landscape, mixed movements and UN Reform
UNHCR's workforce	11. Misalignment between current skillset of personnel and future requirements to meet the challenges UNHCR is facing
	12. Insufficient duty of care to personnel
Security	13. Inadequate strategic security management
Program management	14. Insufficient metrics and evidence-base to demonstrate quality results for affected populations
	15. Inability to serve affected populations through accountable partnerships aligned with operational requirements
Technology	16. Unauthorized access due to insufficiently secure ICT systems and processes
