Improving the targeting criteria would be done by CNAR Benin with technical guidance from the livelihoods unit in RRWA. A framework for targeting of refugees for livelihoods intervention would be shared with CNAR Benin to ensure livelihoods interventions are effectively targeted towards those that need it most to maximize impact. The targeting criteria would include amongst others: the wealth levels of PoCs, the market needs of the community, personal interests and skills capacity of PoCs; these conditions would be clearly shared with PoCs to better understand the targeting process.
