Opening remarks	The meeting started with opening remarks from the Executive Steering Committee Alternate Chair – HE The Deputy Governor, Hon. Peter Lotethiro. He represented H.E. The Governor, Hon. Josphat Koli Nanok who had other urgent duties to attend to in Nairobi. During his remarks, he made reference to a successful launch of KISEDP in Kakuma yesterday and attested to the uniqueness of the project. He called upon all partners to passionately support the initiative. He highlighted the importance of an integrated approach for socio-economic development and a sustainable growth path. He consequently confirmed full support of the project by the Turkana County Leadership. The co-chair, Mr. Muthama Wambua – County Commissioner thanked the chair for organizing this very important meeting and requested strengthening of National					







Government in the forum and in this regard to include the County Director, Education, Director TSC and other National Government bodies to be updated and informed about the projects under KISEDP. He asked issues to do with security and other aspects of combating terrorism to be taken into consideration during various upcoming discussions. He also highlighted the importance of developing an effective valuation framework, thematic Working Group chairs to ensure members fully understand their key roles (as reflected in the draft TORs shared during the steering committee meeting) and for continuity of the discussion, he requested the chair to have strict membership to the Steering Committee and Thematic Working Group meetings.

The co-chair, Mr. Sukru Tayyar Canziglou, Head of Sub-Office UNHCR Kakuma, started by appreciating the Government for their continued and generous support to host refugees and asylum seekers since 1992. He confirmed commitment to continue supporting Government to provide protection and solutions to persons of concern. He congratulated the Government on the leadership shown towards this excellent initiative that's intended to bring all partners to the same table with the aim to strengthen socio-economic development and self-reliance for all residents in Turkana West. He referred to the roundtable event in 2014 and was encouraged to see partners across the humanitarian-development spectrum work through complementarity and coordinate efforts to maximize impact and promote socio-economic development of Turkana West. This confirms KISEDP is a practical implementation of the GCR, in which UNHCR plays a catalytic role to strengthen partnerships also with development and private sector actors to address the underlying causes of displacement and to provide a more adapted response to protracted as well as newly displacement situations.

Mr. Robert Loteleng'o, CECM for Finance and Economic Planning, requested for the County Chief of Staff to be part of the Steering Committee. He also affirmed that the Ministry of Finance and Economic Planning will continue providing support to the KISEDP and he assured the members that the County is closely working with National Government.

Background and Presentation of the KISEDP Strategic Plan **Background.** In 2015, UNHCR and the Government of Kenya agreed to pilot a new approach that would enhance livelihood opportunities and promote inclusive national service delivery systems with the overall goal for refugee and the host population to be able to maximize their potential in an enabling environment and contribute to the socioeconomic development of the region. Subsequently, the County Government, UNHCR and partners embarked on a 15-year comprehensive multi-sectoral and multi-stakeholder plan, also known as the Kalobeyei Integrated Socio-Economic Development Programme (KISEDP). In 2018, the Plan was revised with all stakeholders using a participatory approach, expanded to cover activities for refugee/host communities in Turkana West and launched in Nairobi and Kakuma.







KISEDP Strategic Plan. The revised KISEDP is an integral part of the County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP II-2018-2022) and is informed by the New York Declaration and the Global Compact on Refugees, the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG's), and the 2016 World Humanitarian Summit. A practical example for the Global Compact on refugees, KISEDP envisions that both refugees and host communities will benefit from strengthened national service delivery systems, increased socio-economic opportunities along with sustained investments in people's skills and capabilities, so that they can become drivers of economic growth in Turkana West. Other key characteristics of the Plan include investment in infrastructure across various sectors, engagement with development and private sector actors, and sustainable urban, agricultural and livestock development. This requires developing models for inclusion of basic services within existing systems and ensuring that the government will have the capacity to manage the service delivery in a sustainable manner. It also means increasing efforts and investments to strengthen communities' resilience through cash-based interventions and – in subsequent phases – cash-based transfers to include refugees in development processes, national structures and safety nets. The Plan follows a three-phase approach for implementation and is currently in Phase I (2018-2022).

The Government-led coordination structure consists of a steering committee that provides the overall oversight and guidance on policy matters, a secretariat that facilitates the effective communication and provides the required guidance/support to the chairs, technical leads and other stakeholders and thematic working groups (TWG) to coordinate and discuss strategic programmatic and policy matters on a quarterly basis with all partners, measure and report on progress and closely liaise with sub-county coordination meetings and refugee/host community fora. A multi-stakeholder M&E unit will be established to design and agree with all TWG members a robust methodology for monitoring and evaluation using a risk-based management perspective to ensure proper controls are put in place and reliable analysis is used to ensure continuous improvement.







Adoption of Terms of Reference

The Steering Committee and the Thematic Working Group Terms of Reference are interlinked and have four main components that provide information on background, scope/objectives, governance arrangements and roles and responsibilities.

The TORs for the Thematic Working Groups were shared with and endorsed by the steering committee members. It was agreed that the County Executive Committee Members (CECMs) as chairs to their respective working groups will take the endorsed TORs and review the 4 main components of the document to provide all stakeholders with an opportunity to clarify each actor's roles and responsibilities to ensure a smooth implementation and promote synergies/complementarity.

The members also adopted the Terms of References for the steering committee pending some further improvements to the document. The revised document will be shared with all the steering committee members prior to the next meeting.

Reporting and financial tracking of KISEDP

An annual review of the KISEDP will be conducted to assess the performance of the Plan and appraise the Work Plan for the remaining year(s). This will feed into the 2020 Mid Term Report and 2022 Final Report of the first phase. Both reports will focus on the extent to which progress has been achieved towards objectives, and whether these remain aligned to appropriate outcomes. Monitoring findings and reports will be shared and discussed with all stakeholders through the KISEDP steering committee and thematic working groups and where necessary and relevant, countermeasures will be taken.

During the meeting, the chair and members agreed on the need to develop a progress report of the first year of implementation of KISEDP including achievements, areas to be strengthened and prioritized to ensure transparency and financial accountability under KISEDP. This will also provide the necessary evidence to inform the steering committee members and allow them to provide the necessary oversight and strategic guidance on policy matters to all stakeholders.

The chair tasked the secretariat to support the TWG chairs to develop a consolidated 2018 progress report for all components. To ensure the deadline would be met, the chair requested and agreed with the secretariat to share the reporting template and for members to provide their inputs at the latest by April 2019. The consolidated 2018 report will be reviewed with all chairs in June 2019 after which the document will be shared with the SC chair that will after endorsement share with all relevant stakeholders.







Action points

The chair/co-chairs agreed with the members on the below action points and next steps. The secretariat will support the chair and liaise with the Thematic Working Group chairs and members to follow up on the below prior to the next meeting.
