



■ Women & Children (Boys&Girls <18 years) ■ Men 18 years and above


## **Highlights**

- On 12 January 2014, AFAD the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 212,784 including 110 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the weekend period of 10-12 Jan 2014, a total of 2,570 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 110 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR Field Team continued to be in contact with the local authorities as well as NGOs to follow up on the situation in Telabyad and at Akcakale border. Reportedly Syrian refugees continued to arrive to Turkey and were admitted from Akcakale border. UNHCR was informed by Sanliurfa provincial authorities that during the weekend on 11 Jan. 2014, about 600 new arrivals have been admitted from Akcakale border and about 300 of them were sent to Viransehir camp. Local authorities informed UNHCR that a few hundreds new arrivals will be temporarily accommodated in Viransehir camp pending instructions of AFAD Hq.
- In consultation with AFAD Hg, UNHCR will provide 316 wash containers to the camps according to the needs. The first 20 containers are sent to Nusaybin camp and there will be more sent to other camps in Adiyaman and Hatay Yayladagi and Altinozu according to agreement with AFAD. In addition to the wash containers, UNHCR is also funding the health units in Adiyaman, Kahramanmaras and the camps of Sanliurfa (Ceylanpinar, Akcakale and Viransehir) that will be changed from tent to prefab structures.
- Local officials in Mardin Midyat camp informed UNHCR that the social workers from the Ministry of Family and Socials Policies, together with staff from Social Assistance and Solidary Foundation of Midyat subgovernorate are conducting a survey in the camp, visiting all the tents individually to identify the people with special needs (PSN) and their access to psycho-social and physiotherapy assistance. Reportedly the assessment is planned to be conducted in 8 days, but may take longer due to shortage of interpreters.
- On Monday 13 Jan, in cooperation with AFAD Hq. UNHCR Turkey started aweek-long training program for all the interpreters working in all the camps. For the interpreters working in 3 camps in Urfa, the training is conducted in Harran camp and is planned to be completed in 4 days. 212 interpreters will be attending from 3 camps (Ceylanpinar, Akcakale and Harran). The training will continue for other camps' interpreters.
