

Background information

The Maban Risk Communication and Community Engagement Working Group (RCCE-WG) is comprised of 21 humanitarian partners in Maban County who have come together to harmonize their approach to COVID-19 risk communication and community engagement. The RCCE-WG reports to the Maban County COVID-19 Technical Working Group.

The RCCE-WG has a COVID-19 Rumor Tracking and Management Sub-Committee which is led by Internews and the Danish Refugee Council (DRC). The role of this sub-committee is to support partners to ensure accountability to affected populations amid the emergency response to COVID-19.



Cascaded trainings

On Tuesday 09 June 2020, the COVID-19 Rumor Tracking and Management Sub-Committee organized a training of trainers for all humanitarian partners in Maban. The training, which was facilitated by Internews, was targeted at introducing participants to the concept of rumors, rumor tracking methodology, and ways to report and respond to rumors.
