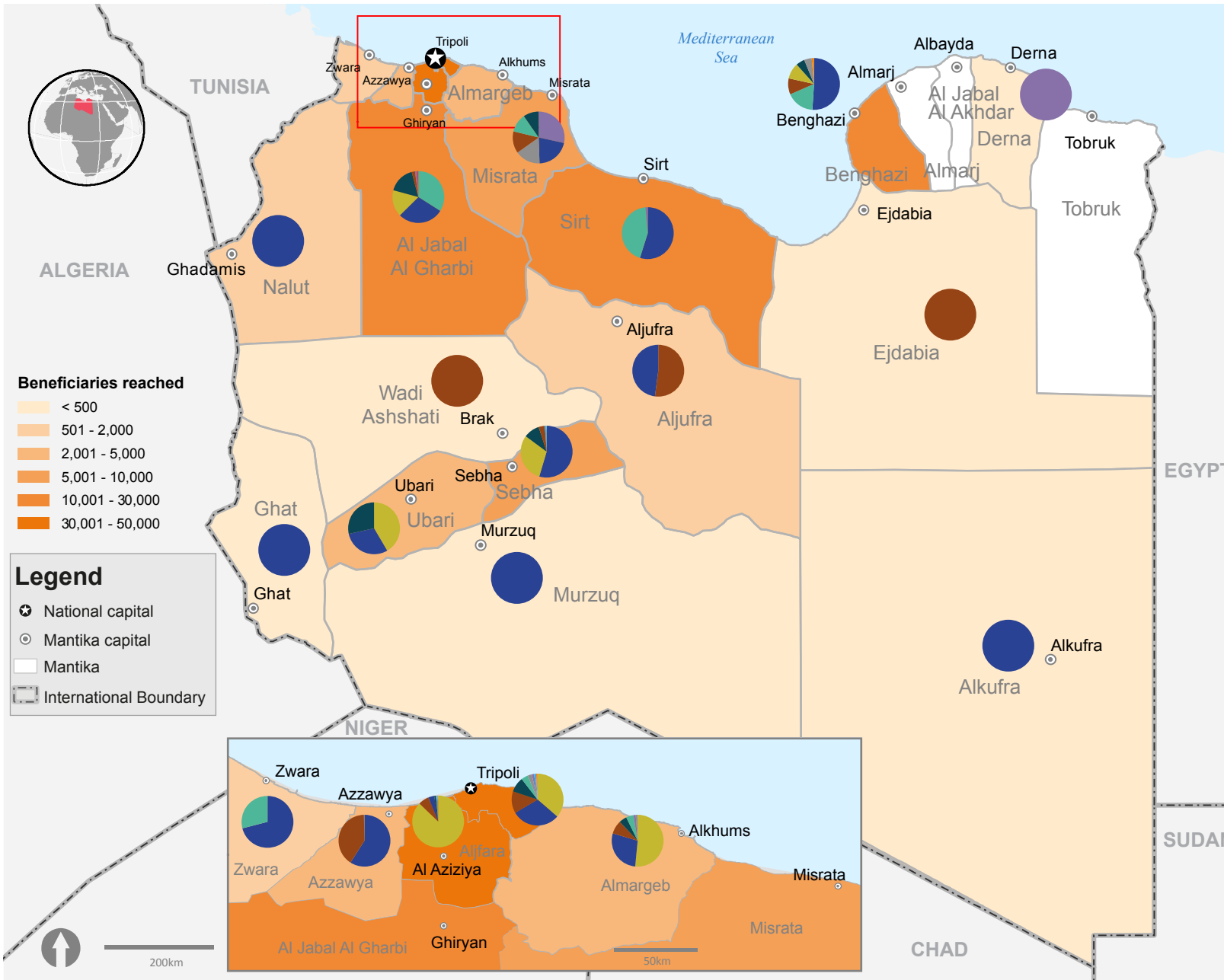


# Libya: Protection Sector response snapshot January-December 2018

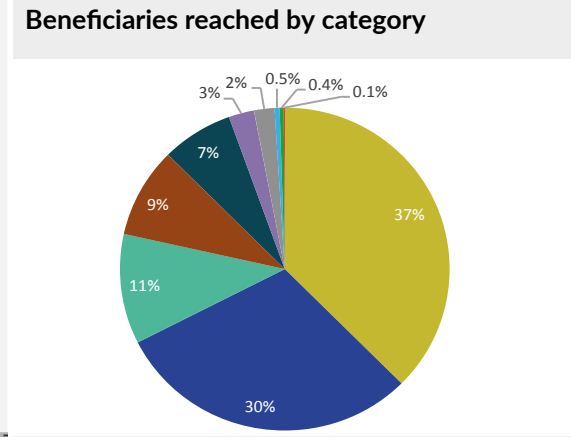

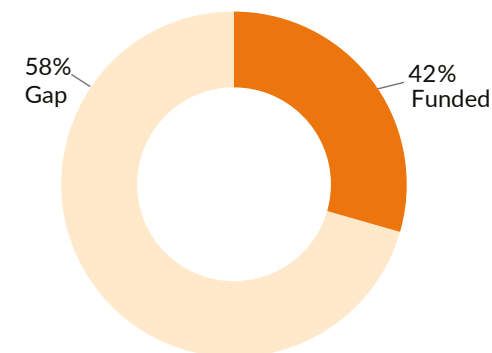
