[Introduction to the Core Humanitarian Standard](#)

This course will help you to understand and apply the Core Humanitarian Standard (CHS), and in doing so improve the quality, accountability and effectiveness of humanitarian responses.

[Sphere in Practice](#)

The online training is based on the 2018 edition of the Sphere Handbook and reflects the major challenges currently faced by the sector. It features realistic examples from complex and protracted crises, a range of settlement scenarios including urban settings, and covers many topics including Protection from Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA). Dynamic links to the Interactive Sphere Handbook will help you connect these scenarios to the guidance provided by Sphere standards.

CASH

[Cash and Voucher Assistance - The Fundamentals](#)

This course will introduce you to the fundamentals of Cash and Voucher Assistance (CVA) and will help you to begin understanding it. No knowledge of CVA is required to participate in this course, so if you are a complete beginner don't worry, you are in the right place.

[Core Cash and Voucher Assistance Skills for Programme Staff](#)

This course is structured around the project cycle and covers all of the key skills required to design, implement and monitor cash and voucher assistance. The course is focused on a technical/programmatic perspective, and incorporates examples and case studies from multiple sectors.

It highlights the key opportunities, misconceptions and challenges for mainstreaming environmental issues into humanitarian action.

This module explains what MEAL (Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability, and Learning) is – its individual parts, its overall structure and its purpose and benefits. It covers the five key steps in the MEAL Phase Model and explain the benefits of a strong MEAL system supported by common ethical principles. This module also explores the ways in which MEAL should be considered as part of the larger project plan

[Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability and Learning for Development Professionals](#)

This course builds the capacity of development and humanitarian professionals in the area of Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability and Learning (MEAL). Learners will increase their understanding of MEAL, test their new knowledge through case-based scenarios, and enhance their ability to track the progress and impact of their projects.

Learn how to establish a dynamic and responsive Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability and Learning (MEAL) system in the earliest phase of an emergency response.
