NEED ANALYSIS

- 2021 HNO: 13.4 million people are estimated to be in need of humanitarian assistance with 2.6 million people in need of NFI support, a 4.5% increase from 2020.
- 2022 HNO: The Shelter & NFI sectors completed the analysis plan and associated questionnaire which forms part of the MSNA. One key indicator has been included for NFI to measure the availability and affordability of NFI items.

RESPONSE

- 2021 HRP: The final draft of the 2021 HRP was circulated for final comment. The NFI sector revised the narrative to better reflect the situation. OCHA aims to publish the 2021 HRP soon, pending final clearance.
- Winter Preparations: The NFI sector is preparing for winter through revision of the PiN, geographic prioritization, and associated 2021/22 winter strategy. A winter 2020/21 lessons learned workshop will also be held to further inform preparations.
- GBV Mainstreaming: The NFI sector is actively following up on referral pathways related to GBV mainstreaming. Related indicators are currently being tracked through our 4Ws. The sector has also provided guidance and reviewed the safe distributions guidelines and associated tools.
- Resource Mobilisation: The Syria Humanitarian Fund (SHF) launched its first standard allocation of 2021. The SNFI sector envelope was \$5 million USD. 5 project submissions received for NFI. The sector determined the priorities based on examining the PiN and severity against the previous response.

GAPS / CHALLENGES

- The inflation rate continues to pose challenges to partners particularly in procuring items.
- Based on Post Distribution Monitoring, beneficiaries have reported concerns over the quality of items and delayed distribution of seasonal items.
- Access and safety continue to be challenges in some parts of the country as well as partner capacity and funding.




