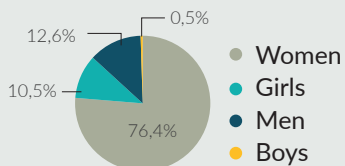

Legal Advice and Representation

10%

of members offer legal services related to access to justice, strengthening the coordination between Public Ministries (prosecutors) of the region and the investigation and international judicial cooperation in the cases of illicit trafficking and smuggling of refugees and migrants.

- 1 Deepening of the identification risks linked to armed conflict and organized crime.
- 2 Of the responses gathered, three risks are associated with displacement: recruitment, sexual abuse, and threats.

- Intervention strategies to promote the access to services and protection mechanisms (access to justice, direct assistance, and case derivation).
- Strategies to mitigate the impact of registered violence against the refugee and migrant population from Venezuela.
- Strengthening of institutional and population capacities to respond to situations of illicit trafficking and smuggling of refugees and migrants.



HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND SMUGGLING

Regarding the identification of risks and affectations, the Human Trafficking and Smuggling Sub-Sector identifies the need to channel intervention strategies towards:

Case management: 1 assistance, referrals, registration, information management.

More holistic responses, 2 including the intersectoral work and cross-cutting axes: integration / social inclusion / economic autonomy for victims of trafficking.

Diagnostics 3 about routes, profiles, general information about illicit trafficking and smuggling of people.

Sharing good practices 4 in line with studies, diagnostics and information gathering.

Position aspects related to **illicit trafficking linked to double affectation and specific groups in vulnerable situations.** 5

Access to specialized services focused on gender 6 psychosocial assistance, specialized shelter.

Policies and procedures: 7 include elements of route identification, modus operandi, patrons.

Capacity building: 8 case identification, risk mitigation, prevention actions and sensibilization.
