

Access to services

- 1 | Adaptation of services to the specific needs and worldview of the populations.
- 2 | Translation services in non-Spanish speaking countries.
- 3 | Mental health in trauma management for children, adolescents, and youth.
- 4 | Attention routes for survivors of gender-based violence, in particular, domestic and sexual violence.
- 5 | Capacity building and training in leadership, participation, and management of institutional relations.
- 6 | Access routes to educational offers under conditions of equality.
- 7 | Training courses to integrate them into the labor market.
- 8 | Adequate housing and territory for those communities that want to remain in rural contexts.
- 9 | Training for officials, members of the public force and organizations in collective rights, self-determination, self-government, and the Convention 169.

- 1 | Risks of human trafficking, sexual exploitation, organized crime, and double affectation.
- 2 | Impacts of double affectation and organized crime on children and youth.
- 3 | Characterization of the levels of academic/technical preparation regionwide.
