
## **CROSSING THE CONTACT LINE:** AUGUST 2021 Snapshot



- The resolution 787 dated 28 July 2021 came into force on 5 August, 2021. According to it, travellers entering Ukraine are generally required to self-isolate for ten days except for those in certain categories. The installation of the smart phone GEO-tracing app Vdoma has become a mandatory requirement again (for the first time since may 2020). Those who cannot install the Vdoma app are subject to observation in a state run facility. If a person crossing from NGCA has been invited to receive a COVID-19 vaccine in Ukraine, self - isolation is not necessary.
- O During August, 9,029 vulnerable elderly persons were transported across the Stanytsia Luhanska EECP by an electric vehicle provided by the NGO Proliska.










#### **R2P OBSERVATIONS**

- In August, 1,139 persons, 51 per cent of those who entered GCA via Novotroitske EECP took antigen tests for COVID-19 as did 2,289 pesons, 8 per cent of those who entered GCA via Stanytsia Luhanska EECP. Meanwhile, in Donetska Oblast, 109 people were referred to the observation facility, because they had no mobile phone or a phone that could not download the Vdoma app. There were no observation facilities in Luhanska Oblast.
- Since Resolution 787 was adopted, people placed in observation facility in Hostre settlement have faced difficult conditions: when R2P team started monitoring the situation and conditions since 6 August, there was no food in the facility until 18 August. The problem was resolved due-to NGO Proliska intervention. Moreover, PCR tests were performed only on Tuesdays, so that people sometimes had to wait for up to a week to be tested.
- As the demand for mobile phone purchases increased, vendors took advantage by adding on and charging for extra phone applications. This problem was solved after R2P intervention.

### NUMBER OF CROSSINGS IN AUGUST

The total number of crossings in August 2021 was **90,860**. Almost 94 per cent of all people crossing between the GCA and the NGCA in August did so through the Luhansk EECP. In Donetska Oblast, **2,612** people were authorized to cross to the GCA and **3,205** to the NGCA. In Luhanska Oblast, **42,375** people crossed the contact line to the GCA and **42668** to the NGCA.
