Summary of the week's Mentoring: Key Activities completed:

- Coordination Meeting:

We as the representative of the humanitarian partner DRC (Ala'a Mohammed Nasser), and the local authority representatives (Executive Units: Saif Al Raimy and Sameh Al ~~Abry~~) As the site managers and FPs in Saber and Al ~~Garad~~.

We discussed about the SMC focal point to engage ExU focal point from their respective sites in the coordination meetings and showing them all related topics of coordination meetings which are;

- Checklist before the meeting such as: Sending invitation, agenda of the meeting, minutes taking,
- Following up on action points.
- How to set an Agenda
- The key roles in a meeting: such as: (Chairperson, Minute Taker, and Translator)
- During the meeting, At the end of the meeting, After the meeting
- Types of Meeting at Site Level: (Coordination meetings at Site level, Sectorial Meetings and Camp Committee-Service Providers meeting).

- The commitment of service providers/ partners to attend the CCCM coordination meetings.
- ~~Covide~~ - 19
- The identification of meeting location by some participants.
- There is no location inside Saber or Al ~~Garad~~ sites to hold the coordination meetings.
- Miscoordination between the two parts of CCCM in the site (DRC and ExU).

Solutions:

- To provide transportation allowance for ~~Lahj~~ local authorities participants.
- To raise and escalate the issue of not committed attending participants to the CCCM coordination meeting.
- To strength and increase the coordination and communication between DRC FP and ExU FP.
- To implement and conduct the preventing precaution regarding Covide-19: (Wearing Masks, social distancing, Hand washing stations/points).
- To conduct the coordination meeting Bi – Weekly meeting regularly.
- To use ENASH foundation room to hold the coordination meetings for Saber and Al ~~Garad~~ sites.
