Messaging raising concerns for population to become hidden which will result in them becoming more vulnerable and unable to access healthcare due to ID being requested. Need to provide ensure provision of support in nondiscriminatory fashion with ID requirement.

The Chair confirmed this was raised with the Immigration Minister – fees waived, but what does it mean? Replacement of documents – but how long will it take? Is there a temporary proposal? Need to build the blocks where the gaps are – is there support we can provide to support the issuance of documentation: processing fees, cost medical tests required, etc.</li> <li>Gaps exist is addressing the response: costs associated with replacing documents, transportation, etc. Protection coordination will compile a list of the gaps and their implications and share with the wider group. We can also provide overview of the various immigration documents which will help to guide and inform messaging.</li> <li>IOM met with Charge d'Affaire at Haitian Embassy who confirmed they are waiving the fees to replace passports – if they were valid. For those that were expired, they are not eligible. It is not clear if these are locally issued passports or not, but likely.</li> </ul>	Questions being asked by communities and individuals to be shared and compiled so that responses can be secured from Gvt when information is available  To clarify if replacement of passports can be done for those who may have obtained them in Haiti	All agencies to provide inputs on frequently asked questions

Education	<ul> <li>UNICEF indicated that formal school approval is being received this week but acknowledged that uniforms may take time. Distribution is managed by Social Services. Asked whether there is any stumbling block to provision of same.</li> <li>ISRAID – Further noted the situations with the schools in Gran Bahama - most schools are not functioning; of 22 schools, only 3 are clean enough for resume classes, and most need remediation and confirmation that they are structurally sound.</li> <li>Team Rubicon USA noted that they are assisting with the cleaning of schools in Gran Bahama, and that so far 8 schools in GB have been cleaned out. Will put visualization info on where people can go, need to compile this information to put out for those.  Highlighted all the frontline staff must also be equipped with support, and if not available internally, organizations in the group might be able to help.  Reaffirmed the need for Child Friendly Spaces – brief provided by XX 59 kids from the shelter started swimming through partnership with Lets Swim Bahamas. Started today until next Friday. Kids are given a with swimming stuff getting – starting with 8 sessions currently at Kendal Isaacs gym IOM added there could be the opportunity through NetHOPE to provide chrome notebook for the kids, so they could consider a proposal to them Volunteer from wonder why? – have been at the shelter engaging kids, explaining to them the processes like registration, and why it's important. have been present 10 days at the gym. PSEA	<ul> <li>Question was asked regarding PSEA is being dealt with and Chair confirmed that this issue is being addressed with setting up PSEA mechanisms</li> <li>Protection highlighted that there was a discussion with MOH on referral how to have one coordinator for each island so they can male one phone call if approached by someone on GBV and PSEA and they would know the appropriate channels</li> </ul>	Process to be confirmed with respective Ministries	UNFPA/UNHCR
Cash Based Interventions	<ul> <li>No update from ICRC, on the cusp of starting and looking how to identify the right beneficiaries. Protection would like to influence as PWG because there are increased vulnerabilities for those most in need and vital to have that discussion with social services.</li> <li>OAG – they have a service already in place – credit card is provided where cash is put on a card each month. Can revert on criteria. Need to have a discussion with SS if any of those affected were receiving assistance previously.</li> <li>Potential three types of cash assistance which could be provided –urgent cash ass, longer term cash assistance and then assistance for documentation. Criteria to be agreed with SS on how to prioritize the most vulnerable</li> <li>Declaration time for those who may have passed – officially what might be put in place to overcome the 7 year delay of declaration for people to access NIB and have closure.</li> </ul>	OAG to revert on criteria adopted for those below poverty line prior to Dorian  OAG to revert on potentially what may be put in place regarding official death certification	OAG



	<ul> <li>Team Rubicon USA asked if anyone had details on a temporary bank in the local market.</li> <li>Cash was discussed in shelter meeting – very limited for families – once per month, not good for longer term need. Government considering putting in place 1/last month for families, screening, just for the most vulnerable families.</li> <li>IOM noted usually the cash cards are not for non-nationals and whether this might be the case in this response</li> <li>OAG indicated Eugene Dupuch Law School wanted to do a documentation program for kids, starting with the Ranfurly home, will do that free of charge, for orphanages.</li> <li>UNHCR emphasized these were the gaps to be filled. Noted discussion with MOH on referral how to have one coordinator for each island so they can make one phone call if approached by someone.</li> </ul>	OAG to share details of Eugene Dupuch Law school to develop leaflet on services being provided	Drotoction working
