82.4 MILLION PEOPLE DISPLACED IN 2020

82.4 million people in the world are fleeing war, violence or persecution. If they were a country, they would have a population almost as large as Iran's, Germany's or Turkey's.

Times 2 in 10 years. The number of displaced people in the world has doubled in the past decade. In 2010, there were around 41 million, in 2020 there were over 82 million.

48 million people in the world are internally displaced. This means that well over half of the people fleeing violence, war or persecution have never left their own country.

86 % of refugees and Venezuelans displaced abroad are hosted in developing countries, that's almost 9 out of 10. The Least Developed Countries provided asylum to 27 per cent of the total
