Catherine participated in the 6th edition of Empowering Refugees, which took place at the Rondon 5 Interiorization Center in 2021.

At the end of the course, she was approved to work as a kitchen officer by the project's partner company, Sodexo. In December 2021, together with her husband and three small children, Catharine was relocated to join the team that works at the group O Boticário's facilities. Upon arriving in São José dos Pinhais, she was sheltered by Casa Santa Dulce dos Pobres, managed by Caritas Paraná in partnership with UNHCR, in order to adapt and integrate with the city during the first month.

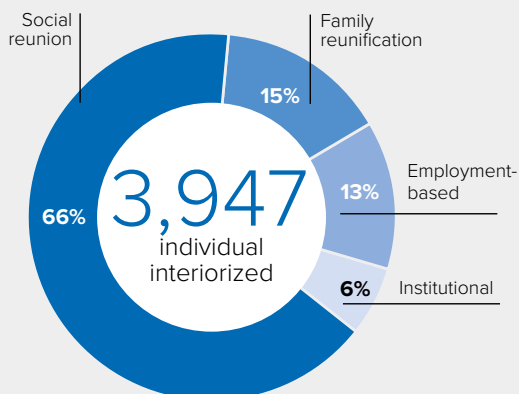

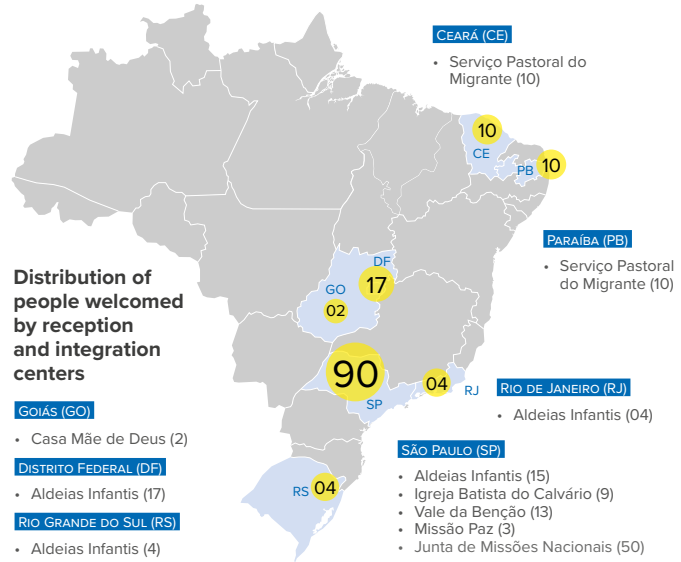

In these two months, **53,509 thousand items**, such as masks, backpacks and hygiene kits, were donated to UNHCR partner organizations, such as universities, municipal and state actors and non-governmental organizations that work with migrants and refugees. The donations were distributed to support the departure of relocated people from the reception and integration centers, as well as to support them to access, with safety and dignity, local integration activities.

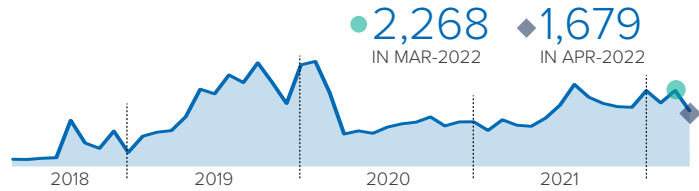

Record of the Interiorization Strategy from April 2018 to February 2022

The Brazilian federal government's Interiorization strategy, which is being implemented through Operation Welcome, involves the voluntarily relocation of Venezuelan refugees and migrants from the states of Roraima and Amazonas to other Brazilian cities. UNHCR, in partnership with other UN agencies and civil society organizations, has continued to support and contribute to the strategy since it was first implemented. 316 women participated in the initiative, **147** were hired and **260** people relocated from Boa Vista to other cities in the country. More than **R\$960 thousand** were invested in training, employability and internalization.

The **Companies with Refugees Platform** is a UNHCR initiative implemented through the Global Compact in order to promote employability, entrepreneurship, means for developing knowledge and awareness and engagement from the private sector. Employers can offer job opportunities through the Employment based Interiorization modality. The Center for Coordination of Interiorization (CCI) is the one responsible for intermediating the selection, interviews and hiring of refugees and migrants.



The first edition of the project **Empowering Refugees** was held between 2015 and 2016 in São Paulo. In 2019 the project extended its activities beyond the geographical region surrounding the city of Boa Vista and began to offer training to women sheltered in shelters.
