

## DJIBOUTI - KEY COUNTRY STATISTICS



### FGM PREVALENCE RATE

The estimated prevalence of FGM in girls and women (15-49 years) is 93.1% (MICS 2006). This appears to have decreased from 98% in 1991 (Union National des Femmes de Djibouti 1991).

Figures also suggest a very slight difference (2.4%) in FGM prevalence between girls and women (15-49 years) who live in urban and rural areas with estimated FGM prevalence at 93.1% and 95.5% respectively (MICS 2006).

The most prevalent type of FGM practised in Djibouti is Type III (67.2), with 24.9% having Type IV and 6.4% Types I or II (MICS 2006).

The Djiboutian government has passed legislation that specifically prohibits the practice of FGM (MICS 2006).
