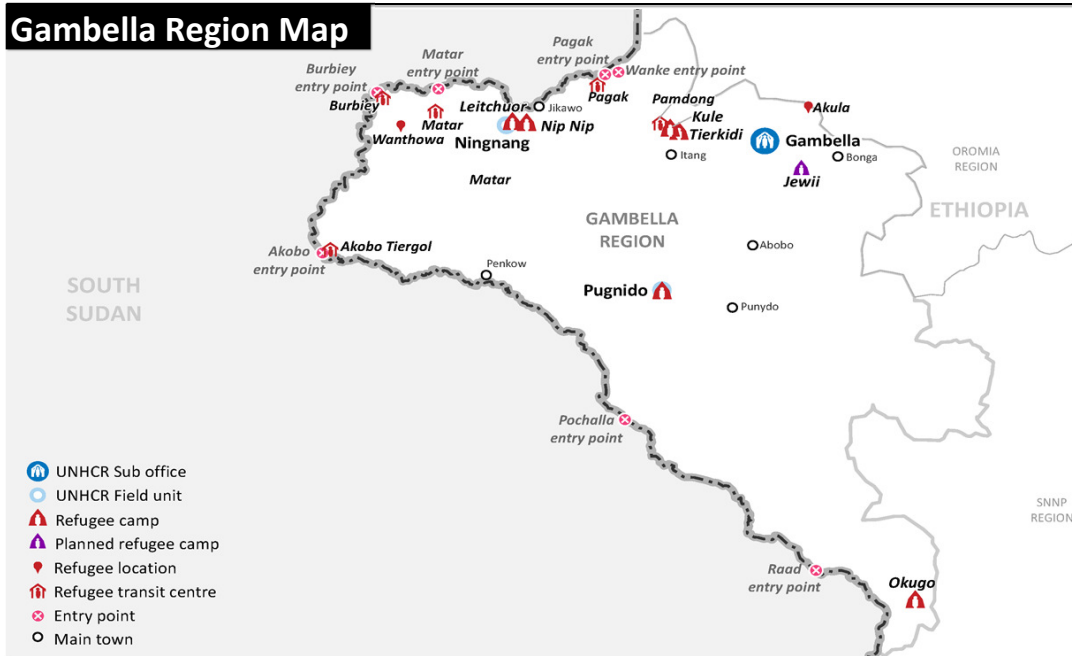


## Gambella Region Map

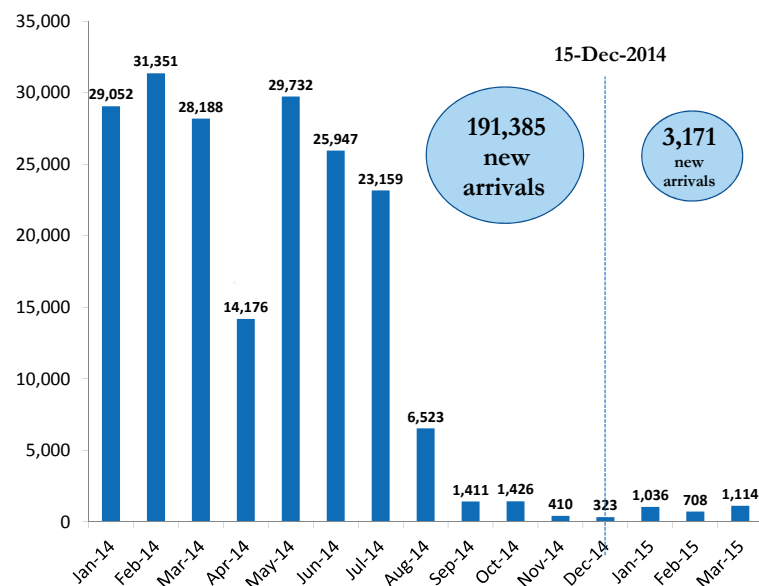
