### **January 2022**

#### Access:



- Tanganyika: 20 tons of food looted in Kabeke (Manono)

### Population movements:

- Tanganyika : Nyunzu Territory hosts about 3,300 people who fled insecurity in Kabalo

- Haut-Katanga: More than 12,000 people were displaced following an incursion by armed group in Mitwaba

# March 2022



### Natural disaster:



- Haut-Lomami: 131 schools collapsed after heavy rains in Bukama, Kamina, and Malemba Nkulu territories.

### May 2022

#### Population movements:



- Tanganyika : Malemba village in southern Nyunzu territory received 2.650 newly displaced people after nearly a year of calm

- Tanganyika: More than 3,915 newly displaced people arrived in Kongolo from Maniema (Kabambare Territory)

#### Access:



- Tanganyika: 50 peaple including 11 women (local\_IOM\_PBF project workers) abducted on the Lambo Katenga - Kasongo Mukuli axis north of Kalemie

### Epidemic:



- Tanganyika: INRB confirms a case of Polio in the Kongolo area, first case in the province since 2017

### **July 2022**

### Coordination:



- Tanganyika: First multisectoral and coordinated assistance on the Sange - Kabeke axis in Manono since the crisis began in January

### September 2022

### Population movements:



- Tanganyika : Nearly 10,000 people fled armed attacks in the Kiambi Health Zone (Manono

#### Access:



- Tanganyika: Humanitarian flights to Nyunzu suspended due to an explosive remnant of war found near the airfield

### **November 2022**

#### Access :



- Tanganyika: Four humanitarian organizations withdrew from Kiambi HZ (Manono Territory) due to



### Population movements:

→ - Tanganyika : Approximately 11,000 people displaced due to insecurity in the Kiambi Health Zone



### Education:

- Tanganyika: 72% of 178,740 school-age children are not attending school in Nyunzu Territory due to parental poverty and population movements

### February 2022

#### Coordination:



- Tanganyika : First humanitarian mission to Kisengo int the northen Nyunzu territory which has been inaccessible for several months due to insecurity

## Population movements:

- Tanganyika : The humanitarian community supports the return of 1,640 displaced persons from the Kalonda site to their return and relocation village in Kalemie



### Protection:

- Tanganyika: Murder and abduction of 21 people in Butondo (Nyunzu), a village hosting IDPs

### **April 2022**

### Coordination:



- Tanganyika: Operationalization of the Nexus approach in the pilot territories of Kalemie and Nyunzu

### Population movements:



- Tanganyika : Nearly 2,200 people flee Miswaki to take refuge in Kasanga Nyemba, following armed incursions

- Tanganyika: An armed incursion in → Sango Mulambi displaced nearly

### **June 2022**

### Access :



- Tanganyika: Return of a lull in the south of Nyemba after a peace and reconciliation initiative between communities

### August 2022

### Access:



- Tanganyika : Reopened humanitarian access on the Kabeya Mayi - Kabeya Mukena axis following improved security conditions



Population movements: - Tanganyika : More than 18,000 people returned to northern Nvunzu

### October 2022

#### Population movements:



- Tanganyika: Nearly 16,000 people returned to four of nine health areas that were inaccessible since 2016

### Coordination:



- Tanganyika : First humanitarian mission to the north of Nyunzu, after more than 5 years

- Tanganyika: Declaration of a cholera epidemic in the town of
