

BENIN - KEY COUNTRY STATISTICS



FGM PREVALENCE RATE

The estimated prevalence of FGM in girls and women (15-49 years) is 12.9% (DHS 2006). This appears to have decreased by 3.9% from 16.8% in 2001 (DHS 2001).

The prevalence of FGM in girls and women within the 15-19 age group is estimated at 7.9%, which appears to be 8.4% less than FGM prevalence in the 35-39 age group which is estimated at 16.3% (DHS 2006). There seems to have been a 4.2% reduction in prevalence for girls and women in the age group of 15-19 when compared with figures from 2001 (DHS 2001), which estimated FGM prevalence to be at 12.1%. There is also a suggested 2% decrease in prevalence for women in the age group of 35-39 from 2001 which estimated FGM prevalence to be at 18.3% (DHS 2001).

Figures also suggest a 6.1% difference in FGM prevalence between girls and women (15-49 years) who live in urban and rural areas, with estimated FGM prevalence at 9.3% and 15.4% respectively (DHS 2006).

The most prevalent type of FGM practised in Benin is 'flesh removed' (Types I and II) (97%), with 3.6% having Type III (DHS 2006).

The government of Benin has passed legislation that specifically prohibits the practice of FGM (DHS 2006).
