

GHANA - KEY COUNTRY STATISTICS



FGM PREVALENCE RATE

The estimated prevalence of FGM in girls and women (15-49 years) is 3.8% (MICS 2006). This appears to be a decrease of 1.6% from 5.4% in 2003 (DHS 2003).

The prevalence of FGM in girls and women within the 15-19 age group is estimated at 1.4%, which appears to be 4.3% less than FGM prevalence in the 35-39 age group which is estimated at 5.7% (MICS 2006). There seems to have been a 1.9% reduction in prevalence for girls and women in the age group of 15-19 when compared with figures from 2003 (DHS 2003), which estimated FGM prevalence to be at 3.3%. There is also a suggested 1% decrease in prevalence for women in the age group of 35-39 from 2003 which estimated FGM prevalence to be at 6.7% (DHS 2003).

Figures also suggest a 4% difference in FGM prevalence between girls and women (15-49 years) who live in urban and rural areas, with estimated FGM prevalence at 1.7% and 5.7% respectively (MICS 2006).

The most prevalent type of FGM practised in Ghana is Type II, although Types I and III are also practised. (US Department of State, 2001). *The DHS does not collect data on the type of FGM performed in Ghana.*

The Ghanaian government has passed legislation that specifically prohibits the practice of FGM (MICS 2006).
