The Constitution permits the establishment of state-level military courts regardless of the number of state military personnel. In states with over 20,000 military police officers and state military personnel, including firefighters, the Constitution provides for the establishment of a Court of Military Justice, which hears appeals from state-level military courts, to try and to judge military police officers for military offences.
