
AFGHANISTAN: Cross-Border Movement from Pakistan (as of 15 Dec 2014)




Military operations (ongoing since June 2014) in North Waziristan Agency (NWA) in Pakistan have led to the displacement of thousands of people to surrounding districts in Paktika and Khost provinces in Afghanistan. As of 15 December 2014, 38,916 displaced families have been assessed. Response has been ongoing since 18 June 2014.





1,081 emergency latrines and 2,857 hygiene kits provided; 850 dignity kits distributed.
