## **LAW**

### **ON CENTRAL REGISTERS AND DATA EXCHANGE**

#### **Chapter I - GENERAL PROVISIONS**

##### **Article 1 Purpose of the Act**

The purpose of this Act is:

- a. To establish a central Data Processing Centre on the level of Bosnia and Herzegovina (hereinafter referred to as “BiH”);
- b. To define the registers that are processed in this Centre;
- c. To define the content of specific registers and to define the rules of access to these registers (transmission of data); and
- d. To specify rules on data security and data protection for these registers.

##### **Article 2 Definitions**

The definitions contained in the Law on the Protection of Personal Data shall apply to this law.

#### **Chapter II - CENTRAL DATA PROCESSING CENTRE**

##### **Article 3 Establishment of a Central Data Processing Centre**

A Central Data Processing Centre (hereinafter referred to as “Centre”) shall be established on the level of Bosnia and Herzegovina in Sarajevo.

The Centre shall be established as a multi-institutional service unit (Sector) and shall physically reside within the Premises of the Ministry of Civil Affairs and Communication and at the Entity level in the headquarters of the Entity Ministries of Internal Affairs.

The Centre shall administer the following registers:

- a. Register on JMBs.
- b. Register on passports.
- c. Register on ID cards.
- d. Register on residence.
- e. Register on visas and residency permits.
- f. Register on driver's licenses.
- g. Register on vehicle registration
- h. Register on criminal records

#### **Article 4 Responsibility for Data**

The Center shall maintain registers on behalf of the Ministry for Civil Affairs and Communication or on behalf of other public bodies. These bodies are the "Originating Authorities" for the data contained in the registers. The "Originating Authority" for each database or set of records shall be determined in this law or in laws to be applied by the relevant Originating Authority. Unless explicitly authorised in this law, only the Originating Authority is competent to alter or delete any data falling under its responsibility. It is also responsible for ensuring the accuracy of the information stored in the database provided to the Center.

A Public body that may access data stored in the Center shall be termed "Receiving Authority" for the relevant database or set of records. Receiving Authorities shall be designated by this law or by other laws that are applicable to the relevant Receiving Authority.

In accordance with this Law, the Center shall collect data from the Originating Authorities, store such data and transfer or disclose the data to Receiving Authorities under Article 7. The Center may only otherwise process data on request of Originating or Receiving Authorities. It must respect the laws applicable to itself and to the requesting Authority.

Technical and operational procedures for data transfer, communication and co-operation with relevant authorities shall be regulated by by-laws of the Ministry of Civil Affairs and Communications.

**Article 5**  
**Administration of the Centre**

Assistant Minister of Civil Affairs and Communication shall be Director of the Centre who shall administer the Centre.

The Director shall be nominated by the Minister of Civil Affairs and Communication, and shall be approved by the BiH Council of Ministers.

The Director shall be responsible to the Minister of Civil Affairs and Communication for his or her work for the Centre.

The Minister of Civil Affairs and Communication shall report to the BiH Council of Ministers regarding the activities of the Centre.

The internal organisation of the Centre shall be regulated by a Rulebook on internal organisation. This Rulebook shall be passed by the Minister of Civil Affairs and Communication with the consent of the BiH Council of Ministers.

The Director shall establish the rules regulating the operational work of the Center including, in particular, the rules for the security of data processed by the Centre.

**Article 6**  
**Obligations of the Employees**

Employees of the Centre are obliged to process personal data in accordance with this law, and all other applicable rules.

Employees of the Centre are obliged to keep confidential any information regarding data processed in the Centre to which they are exposed in the course of their employment. This obligation shall remain in place after the cessation of employment.

Applicants for employment at the Centre must be informed of this confidentiality obligation and must sign a written Confidentiality Statement before commencement of employment.

The Director of the Centre shall prepare by-laws regulating standards on confidentiality and non-disclosure of data processed by the Centre and employee's responsibilities to abide by these standards.

Present or former employees shall be liable for any disclosure of confidential information or confidential data contravening paragraph (2) of this Article.

Present or former employees shall be liable for collecting, recording, storing, processing, using or deleting data contained in the Centre in a manner that is in contravention of this Law or other applicable legislation.

Entity criminal laws shall be applied in enforcing paragraphs (5) and (6) of this article.

**Article 7**  
**Offences against the functioning of the Centre**

Any person shall have committed a punishable offence if he/she intentionally:

- a. Gains access to the whole or any part of the computer system of the Centre without authorisation;
- b. Intercepts by technical means the transmission of data to, from or within the computer system of the Centre; or
- c. Criminal codes shall be applied in enforcing this Article.

**Article 8**  
**Disclosure and Transfer of Data**

The Center shall only facilitate the transfer of data from the registers it maintains to a public body of Bosnia and Herzegovina if it receives a request to do so from such body and if:

- a. the request was issued by the Originating Authority of the data in question and complies with the laws to be applied by the Originating Authority

OR

- b. the request was issued by a Receiving Authority that is explicitly authorised to access or be transferred such data by a law

OR

- c. the request was issued by a Receiving Authority that is unable to fulfil its legal obligations without access to or transfer of the requested data, and the public interest against access to or transfer of the data prevails over interests of the person concerned.

The requesting authority is responsible to ensure that these conditions are met.

Every request must contain the name, function and service number of the individual within the requesting authority who, by authorising the request, is

taking responsibility for the fact that the conditions are met. In addition, every request must contain the number of the file to which the request is pertaining. Requests under Art 7 (1) (c) must indicate the legal obligation of the requesting body and the purpose of the request.

The Centre must document all requests and all information made available to it under Art 7 (3) for at least 10 years from the time of request. Each public authority may access information on the requests it has made. The Data Protection Commission shall have full access to these records in order to ensure the legality of the operations of the Centre and the legality of the requests.

The Centre shall ensure through technical and organisational means that all requests originate from public bodies and contain the information contained in Art 7 (3).

Each requesting authority shall ensure that data accessed or transferred to it shall only be used for the purpose for which it was requested.

The Director may refuse or stop a transfer in case of an obvious violation of the law. The Minister of Civil Affairs and Communications must be notified of this immediately and take a final decision on the transfer.

## **Article 9**

### **Provision on Data Security**

The Director shall issue an operational work plan as referred to in Article 5 (6) of this Law which shall define procedures for preserving the security of data stored in the registers, to include procedures for access maintenance, administration of data, establishing levels of security, storage and backup procedures, and provisions for disaster recovery. The Center must be protected against natural disasters in an appropriate manner.

## **Article 10**

Any person involved in data processing shall be subject to the Law on Data Protection.

## **Chapter IV - RULES ON REGISTERS**

**Article 11**

The purpose of the JMB Register is to maintain and preserve the integrity of the set of unique record identifiers for all citizens and permanent residents of BiH.

**Article 13**  
**Technical Processing of Data in the Register**

Only the Originating authorities competent for the administration of JMB's may, in accordance with their legal obligations, engage in the technical processing of data in this register.

The Originating authorities for the data in this register are the competent authorities in the Law on Personal Identification Numbers (JMB).

## **Article 14** **Transfer of Data**

Pursuant to Article 7, the following data elements may be transferred to or accessed by a requesting authority in Bosnia and Herzegovina:

The purpose of the Register on Passports is:

- a. To control and monitor the issuance of passports.
- b. To prove the validity of passports.
- c. To prove the identity of a person possessing a passport or to whom the passport has been issued.
- d. To preserve the security and integrity of the passport document.
- e. To implement the Law on Travel Documents.

Only the Originating authorities competent for the administration of passports may, in accordance with their legal obligations, engage in technical processing of data in this register.

The Originating authorities for the data in this register will be designated by the Law on Travel Documents.

### **Article 18** **Transfer of Data**

- b. To control and monitor the issuance of identity cards;
- c. To prove the validity of an identification card;
- d. To prove the identity of a person who possesses an identification card or to whom the identity card has been issued;
- e. To preserve the security and integrity of identity cards;
- f. To implement the Law on Identity Cards of Citizens of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

### **Article 21**

#### **Technical Processing of Data in the Register**

Only the Originating authorities competent for the administration of identity cards may, in accordance with their legal obligations, engage in the technical processing of data in this register.

The Originating authorities for the data contained in this register are the competent authorities in the Law on Identity Cards of Citizens of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

### **Article 22**

#### **Transfer of Data**

The purpose of the register on residence is:

- a. To maintain a list of all residence, both permanent and temporary, registered in BiH.
- b. To automate and establish consistency of residence registration and de-registration throughout the territory of BiH.
- c. To validate a citizen's stated place of permanent or temporary residence.
- d. To implement the Law on Permanent and Temporary Residence of Citizens of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

##### **Article 24 Storage of Data**

The register shall contain the following data elements for each record:

**Article 25**  
**Technical Processing of Data in the Register**

Only the Originating authorities competent for the registration/de-registration of residence may, in accordance with their legal obligations, engage in the technical processing of data (collection, recording and storage, use and deletion of data) in this register.

The Originating authorities for the data in this register are the competent authorities in the Law on Permanent and Temporary Residence for Citizens of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

**Article 26**

Pursuant to Article 7, the following data elements may be transferred to or accessed by a requesting authority in Bosnia and Herzegovina:

**Article 27**  
**Transfer of Data to Third Parties**

Upon application, the name and the address of certain individual residents may be transferred to third parties other than those listed in Article 25 (simple registration authority information).

The transfer of additional information from the register may be done when the person demonstrates a legitimate interest in such information (extended registration authority information).

Depending on the nature of the of substantiated interest, this information may include the following:

- a. Date and place of birth.
- b. Previous first and last names.
- c. Citizenship.
- d. Date of registration and de-registration.

The person affected is to be informed of the application for extended registration authority information before the transfer of the data. Should the person affected substantiate a legitimate interest that the data not be transferred, the extended registration authority information shall not be transferred. This is particularly applicable if facts are substantiated that would justify the assumption that the disclosure of the information could lead to a danger to the body, life or health of the person affected or another person.

The recipient may use the transferred data only for the purpose for which the data was transferred.

A fee may be charged for the furnishing of the registration authority information. The Ministry responsible for the registration authority is authorised to regulate the details of the charging of fees by means of law.

- a. To maintain issued travel visas and residency permits in BiH or abroad.
- b. To control and monitor the issuance of travel visas and residency permits.
- c. To prove the validity of travel visas or residency permits.
- d. To preserve the security and integrity of visas and residency permits.
- e. To implement the Law on Immigration and Asylum.

- e. To support inquiries related to driving licenses from authorised law enforcement agencies within BiH as well as internationally.

- e. To support inquiries from authorised law enforcement agencies within BiH as well as internationally.
- f. To support implementation of sub-state laws on registration numbers.

- e. To support the activities of entity and BiH criminal justice systems.

## **Subchapter 9 - INTERIM AND FINAL PROVISIONS**

### **Article 44**

The Ministry of Civil Affairs and Communications shall adopt by-laws, relevant to this Law, within 90 days of the effective day of this Law.

### **Article 45**

This Law shall enter into force 30 days after the date on which it is published in the Official Gazette of BiH and shall be published in the Official Gazettes of the Entities and the Official Gazette of Brcko District.
