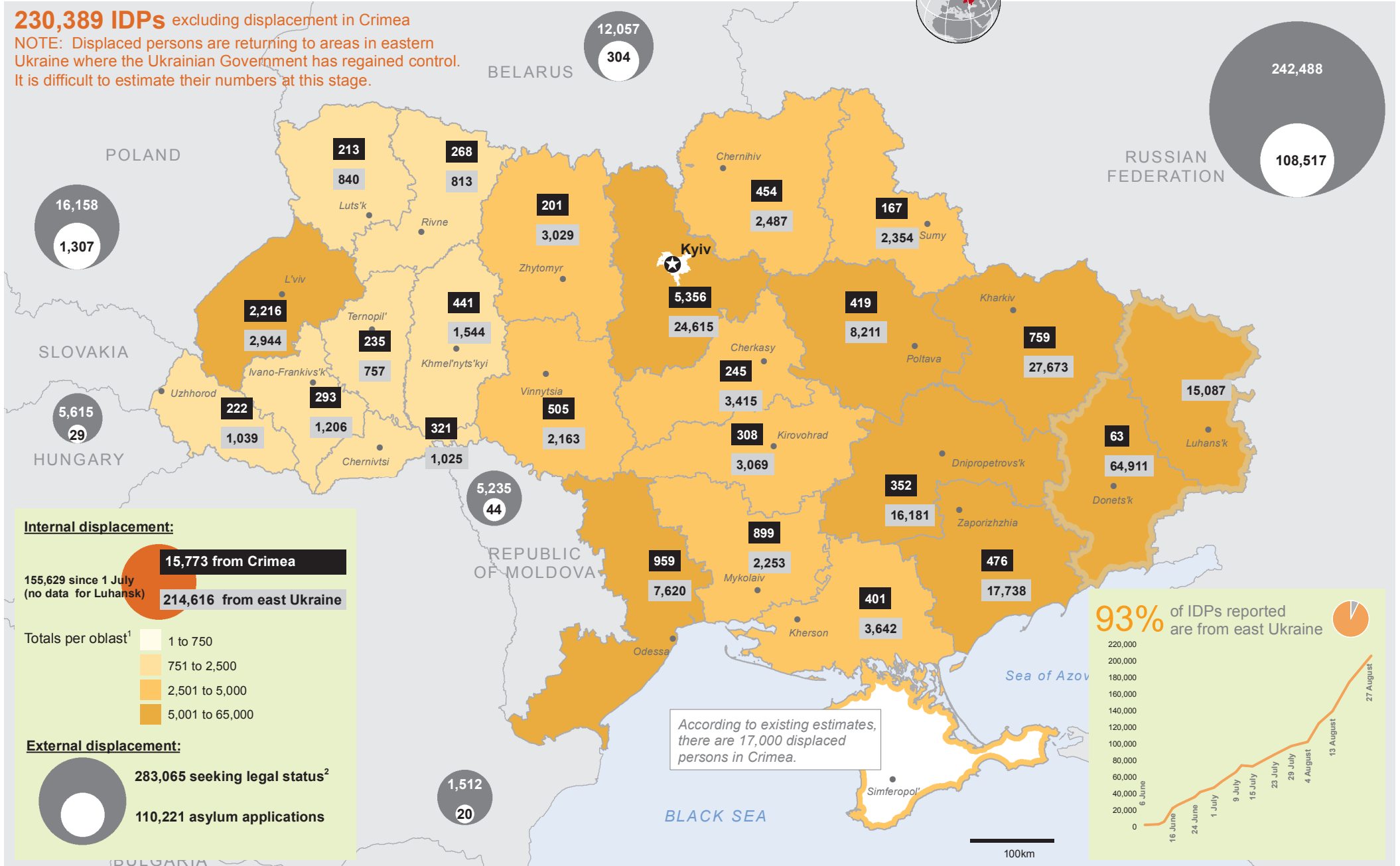


230,389 IDPs excluding displacement in Crimea

NOTE: Displaced persons are returning to areas in eastern Ukraine where the Ukrainian Government has regained control. It is difficult to estimate their numbers at this stage.



The boundaries and names shown and the designations used on this map do not imply official endorsement or acceptance by the United Nations. **Internal Displacement:** Due to the lack of a centralized system of registration, the real figure of IDPs is unknown and is likely to be higher, as local authorities and civil society register only those who approach them. Various organizations report that some displaced persons from the East are reluctant to apply to the authorities because they fear retribution, want to maintain a low profile, and moreover, see little benefit in identifying themselves as there is no special reception procedures established for them.
