











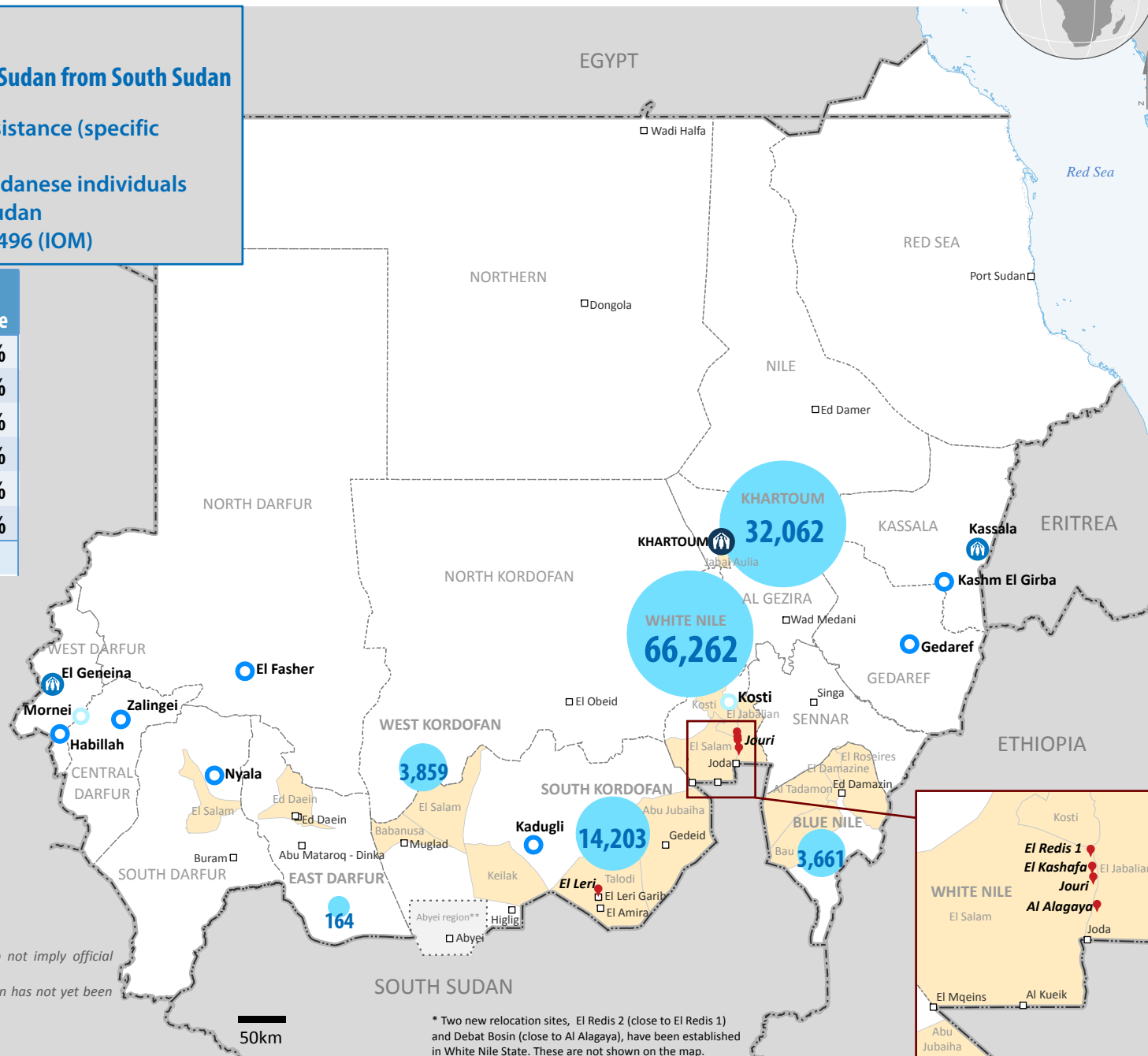


Over **120,211** persons have arrived in Sudan from South Sudan
