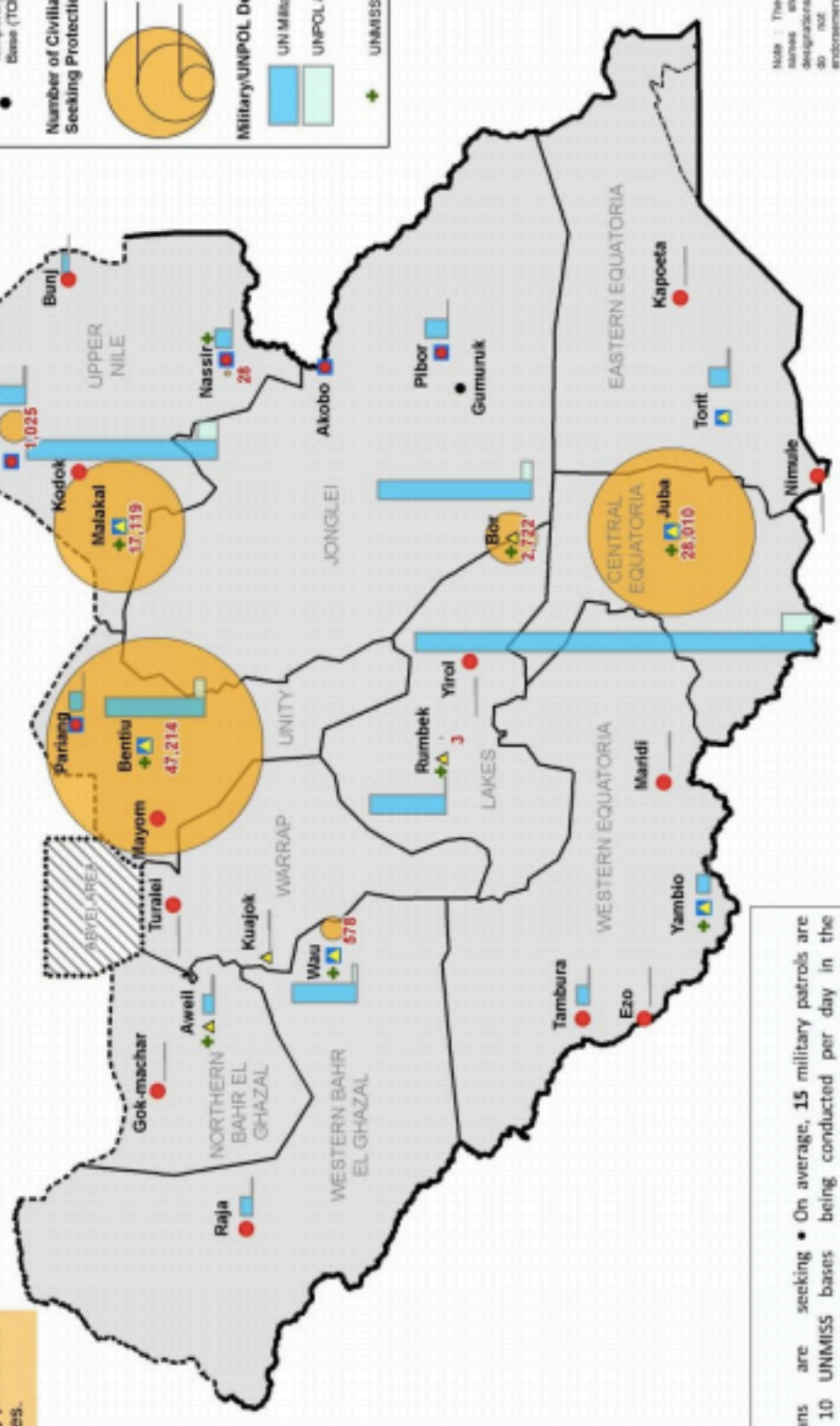

Key Facts

- **96,723** civilians are seeking protection in 10 UNMISS bases including 47,214 in Bentiu, 28,010 in Juba, Malakal and Juba (23,860 in UN House - including 9,976 in PoC3 - and 4,150 in Tomping), 17,119 in Malakal, and **20** UNMISS health clinics are providing medical care.
- On average, **15** military patrols are being conducted per day in the towns of Bor, Juba, Malakal and Bentiu with many more in the PoC sites.
- **20** UNMISS health clinics are providing medical care.
