1 Name of Regulations

These Regulations are the *Criminal Code Amendment Regulations* 2010 (No. 5).

4D Terrorist organisations — Jamiat ul-Ansar (JuA)

- (1) For paragraph (b) of the definition of *terrorist organisation* in subsection 102.1 (1) of the Code, the organisation known as Jamiat ul-Ansar (JuA) is specified.
- (2) For subregulation (1), Jamiat ul-Ansar (JuA) is also known by the following names:
 - (a) Al-Faran;
 - (b) Al-Hadid;
 - (c) Al-Hadith;
 - (d) Harakat ul-Ansar;
 - (e) Harakat ul-Mujahideen;
 - (f) Harakat ul-Mujahidin;
 - (g) HuA;
 - (h) HuM.
