

13 Jul 2010 - An estimated 20,000 people have been displaced last week in the North Kivu Province of the Democratic Republic of the Congo following armed conflict between the national army and the Ugandan armed opposition group Allied Democratic Forces (ADF) in the Beni territory. Humanitarians are particularly concerned because the Beni territory was until now relatively calm, previously hosting an estimated 10,000 internally displaced persons and this is the first displacement involving ADF since 2006.
