1. Background

Disaster relief activities in Nepal are carried out being based on the Disaster Relief Act 1982. This National Disaster Response Framework is prepared to implement and coordinate a response plan of national level disaster by ensuring all the elements of disaster management cycle and allocate appropriate role for governmental and nogovernmental organizations.

2. Objectives and Scope

- 1. The purpose of this framework is to guide more effective and coordinated national response in case of a large scale disaster.
- 2. The scope of this framework consists actions taken immediately before, during and after the disasters, or directly to save lives and property; maintain of law and order; care of sick, injured and vulnerable people; and provide of essential services and protect the public property.
- 3. The scope of this framework is limited to the response preparedness and emergency response at national, regional, district and local level.

3. National System for Disaster Response

- 1. Disaster Relief Act 1982 and Local Self Governance Act 1999 are the basic current legal provisions for disaster response in Nepal.
- 2. Natural Calamity Relief Act 1982 mandated the Ministry of Home Affairs as a lead agency for immediate rescue and relief works as well as disaster preparedness activities. According to Nepal Government's Regulation for Roles Division 2007, MoHA is entirely responsible for disaster management. Hence, the MoHA has been coordinating the activities of disaster preparedness and rehabilitation after disaster.
- 3. The national strategy for disaster risk management is formulated in 2009 to develop Nepal as a disaster-resilient country.
- 4. The Cabinet shall declare, based on the recommendation of the Central Disaster Relief Committee, the state of emergency when the area is affected by the natural calamity and beyond the capacity of Government of Nepal (GoN). The government shall appeal for international assistance.
- 5. The disaster fund for emergency response is channelized from the Natural Calamity Relief Fund at central, regional, district and local level. Prime Minister Relief Fund and Emergency Fund are also mobilized for disaster response during emergency. In addition, the disaster funds are allocated by international and national humanitarian communities for disaster response. Considering the context of both of the above funds shall be mobilized, establishment of funds for central,

regional, district and local level disaster response have been realized.

- 6. The formation of Central Natural Disaster Relief Committee (CNDRC), Regional Disaster Relief Committee (RDRC), District Disaster Relief Committee (DDRC) and Local Disaster Relief Committee (LDRC) based on Natural Calamity Relief Act 1982 for the overall disaster response in Nepal. Additionally, supply, shelter and rehabilitation, relief and treatment sub-committees shall be established. Emergency operation centers are functional at National, regional, district and municipal level for information collection on disaster management, analysis, flow and coordination.
- 7. According to provision of Local Self Governance Act 1999, local authorities (DDC, VDC and Municipality) are playing roles of disaster preparedness and response.


4. International Assistance for Disaster Response

- 1. If required, the Government of Nepal may request to UN Humanitarian Coordinator, international governments, Red Cross Movement, regional organizations, donor communities, I/NGOs, international professional organizations, non-resident Nepalese for international assistance in cash or kind or services to respond to disaster.
- 2. According to appeal of Nepal government, the UN and Red Cross Movement shall appeal for international assistance for disaster response.
- 3. Government of Nepal shall facilitate and coordinate the International Humanitarian Communities by registration of agencies and allocating areas of cooperation that will be guided by to be developed guideline for international assistance.
- 4. The government shall organize appropriate management for relief goods, life saving equipments and search and rescue equipments received through international humanitarian communities, as per the Model Agreement for Emergency Customs Procedure, 2007 between Nepal Government and the UN.
- 5. Government of Nepal shall facilitate the provisions of granting immediate visa, at entry points to International Humanitarian Communities (IHC). In addition, the Government of Nepal shall facilitate and take appropriate action for the issuance of transit visa for IHC and port facilities for relief and rescue materials coming to Nepal via India with Government of India during the disaster.

6. During the large scale disaster, UN Humanitarian Coordinator shall activate the UN cluster system of Nepal. Government of Nepal shall nominate the full time focal person to respective cluster in order to respond to disaster through a coordinated cluster approach.

5. National and International Assistance and Coordination Framework

1. The working modality of disaster response using in-country resources and capacities and with international assistance will be as below:




2. The Cluster Coordination Structure of Nepal is presented below:

- 3. UN international search and rescue teams (UN-INSARAG) coming to the country in response to the appeal of the government and UN Disaster Analysis and Coordination (UNDAC) members will be coordinated by UN humanitarian coordinator as per instruction of the government of Nepal.
- 4. The government shall ensure coordination and reception center at airport and shall allocate the base camp areas to the above mentioned team members.
- 5. The international search and rescue teams and humanitarian assistance team members coming to Nepal shall inform the NEOC in advance about their working duration in the country.
- 6. The NEOC shall prepare a priority action plan for the search and rescue equipments and team members, and humanitarian assistance team members arriving and departing by air or road.
- 7. The government shall organize bilateral and multilateral agreement with the neighboring and other countries for facilitating the arrival process of international search and rescue teams, as needed.
- 8. The government may appeal for the international military service as per the Guidelines for Accepting International Military Assistance/Guidelines for Civil Military Defense Assets, if required.
- 9. In the time of large scale disaster, coordination mechanism among

NEOC/LEMA, OSOCC and MNMCC will be automatically established.In such the situation the NEOC will worak as secretariat of NDRC and also act as coordination center. NEOC may invite the search and rescue teams, and humanitarian agencies to discuss on ongoing operation. Coordination management center of disaster affected area and communication center of various military's coordination center is communicated through the NEOC. The mechanism will be as per below:



- 10. Contact person for each of the above mentioned agencies will be different. In the time of mega disaster the contact persons shall regularly study, analyze and evaluate the situation. Similarly, the contact persons shall coordinate with the national level line ministries, departments, offices, and several entities including international agencies to make the disaster preparedness and response more effective.
- 11. Assigned contact persons for disaster preparedness and response at different offices shall be proactive at the time of mega disaster and contact the NEOC immediately.
- 12. OSOCC shall maintain relationship between government and international responders for facilitation for international response activities, provided working forum for cooperation and exchange information. The UN humanitarian coordinator shall assign specific person and authority for overall coordination.

- 13. The government may accept or reject the search and rescue equipments and teams as well as humanitarian assistance team members and materials based on the prevailing situation.
- 14. INGOs coming or came to Nepal for humanitarian assistance, shall provide assistance and service through government offices, local authorities or NGOs under governmental instruction.
- 15. The MNMCC shall mobilize military resources under the leadership of Nepal Army and in coordination with NEOC and OSOCC.

6. Special Arrangement for National Disaster Response

Special arrangement for effective framework for disaster response shall be as per below:

- Preparedness for disaster response includes early information, analysis and flow of
 information, preparation for damage assessment, awareness and capacity
 enhancement, coordination and prepositioning of logistics and relief materials etc.
 Responders are responsible for accomplishment of those actions within specified
 timeframe.
- 2. Emergency response of humanitarian assistance includes coordination, assessment, search and rescue, logistics, healthcare hygiene and sanitation, shelter, road, electricity, airport, water supply, telecom, rehabilitation of heritages, maintaining registration and record of displaced people, food, non food items, medicines, fuel supply, protection of the vulnerable people, nutritious food for below 5 children, care for children and lactating mothers, safety, evacuation and arrangement of safe open spaces, fire control, debris and dead body management etc. Carrying out those actions based on the national and international standard are the major responsibilities of the responders.
- 3. Relevant ministries, departments, sections, clusters, Red Cross Movement, I/NGOs and CBOs shall be responsible for pre-agreed assignment.
- 4. The NEOC shall keep record and analyze the existing organizational capacity such as experts' roaster, search and rescue teams equipped with essential equipments, list and capacity of hospitals, blood transfusion and stock, emergency communication system and ambulance service.
- 5. During the emergency response, NEOC shall be activated in the time of emergency of **level 4** as stated in NEOC Standard Operating Procedure; command post establishment within NEOC compound; deployment of Disaster Response Focal Points from the concerned ministries at NEOC; establishment of media management center within the Emergency Operation Centers; appropriate arrangement for relief supply; DEOC activation and networking; information dissemination by TV, Radio,

and SMS; and regular information updates to public and disaster victims.

- 6. The Emergency Executive Members Meeting shall be conducted immediately once the incident report received from DDRC. The meeting shall be chaired by Secretary (MoHA), and other members include Joint Secretary (Disaster Management Division), Chief (NEOC), and Chief (Disaster Management Section) who shall analyze the situation based on the incident report to flag out the extent of disaster situations and make decision for coordination and further actions.
- 7. The command post shall be established within the compound of NEOC in order to mobilize the rescue and relief work immediately. The command post team shall be led by Chief (Joint Secretary) from the Disaster Management Division, and other members include Brigadier General from the Directorate of Military Operation, Nepalese Army; DIG from Nepal Police; and DIG from Armed Police Force.
- 8. The Head of NEOC shall work as a focal person for the disaster response operation in disaster situation. The focal persons from different line ministries, departments, security forces shall work under the leadership of head of NEOC.
- 9. The NEOC shall facilitate and coordinate different ministries, departments and offices for early recovery actions parallel of this framework to support Emergency Response Operations.
- 10. The Government of Nepal may review and amend this framework in the recommendation of NDRC.
- 11. Monitoring and evaluation of rescue and humanitarian assistance related activities shall be organized at national and district level. The NDRC shall monitor and evaluate the national level operation. The DDRC shall monitor and evaluate the local level operation. The RDRC shall monitor and evaluate the district level operation. District level integrated information shall be reported to the NDRC.
- 12. This framework shall be effective immediately after the GoN (cabinet) approves after the recommendation of NDRC.

7. National Disaster Response Framework

- 1. As soon as having been received the information about anticipated disaster, the following authorities shall be leading for the following tasks.
- 2. The NDRC, RDRC and DDRC shall organize a meeting according to need and make appropriate arrangement for coordination with national and international GOs and I/NGOs.
- 3. The national, regional, district and municipal level operation centers shall organize coordination for making the response operation effective.

- 4. MoHA and its DM section including following authorities shall play appropriate auxiliary roles being based on the mandate:
 - a. NDRC members, Finance Ministry, MoFA, Defense Ministry, MoHP, MoFALD, MoAD, NHRC, Social Welfare Council, Department of Immigration, Department of Water Induced Disaster Control, Department of health Service, Department of Livestock, Department of Mines and Geology, Department of Hydrology and Meteorology, Department of Road, Department of Drugs Administration, Central Bureau of Statistics, Department of Health Service, DUDBC, Nepal Seismological Center, Garbage Technical Cooperation Center, National Trauma Center, Nepal Army, Nepal Police, Armed Police Force, Fire Brigade Offices, Urban Search and Rescue Teams, Regional and District Disaster Rescue Team Members, DDD offices, VDC and Municipal offices, Civil Aviation Authority, Nepal Food Corporation and other Ministries, Departments, GOs and I/NGOs.
 - b. UN agencies including Humanitarian Coordinator (UNOCHA, UNDP, UNICEF, WHO, WFP, FAO, UNFPA, IOM, UNHABITAT, UNHCR, UNDSS), relevant clusters, Multinational Organizations, ICIMOD, Diplomatic Missions in Nepal, SAARC, INGOs, Red Cross Movement, ICAO, and other international organizations.
 - c. Nepal Red Cross Society, Nepal Scout, Private and Governmental Hospitals, Nepal Academy of Science and Technology, DP-Net Nepal, Communication Medias, Community Organizations, Community volunteers, Radio Nepal, Himalayan Rescue Association, Mountaineering Training Institute, Airlines Association, Nepal Medical Council, Nepal Nursing Council, Contractors' Association, Transport Association, Federation of Nepal Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Telecom providers, Nepal Engineering Association and other specialized organizations.
 - d. The following actions after disaster shall be carried out under the leadership of the following organizations in coordination with the above mentioned organizations.
