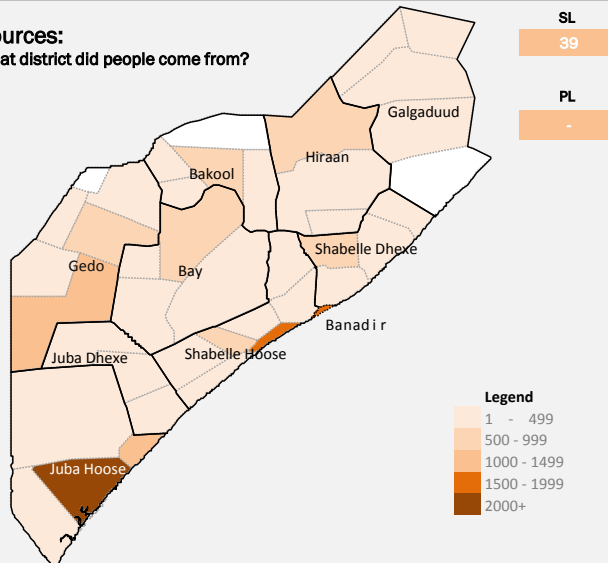


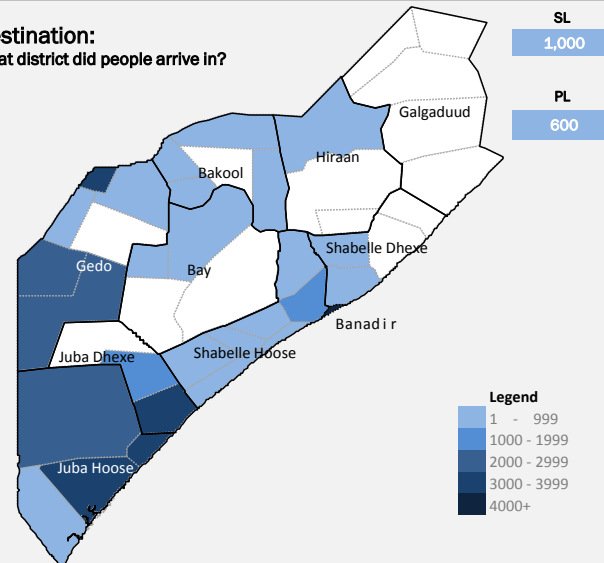
Total movement from South Central: \* **37,000**

Total movement within Somalia: **39,000**

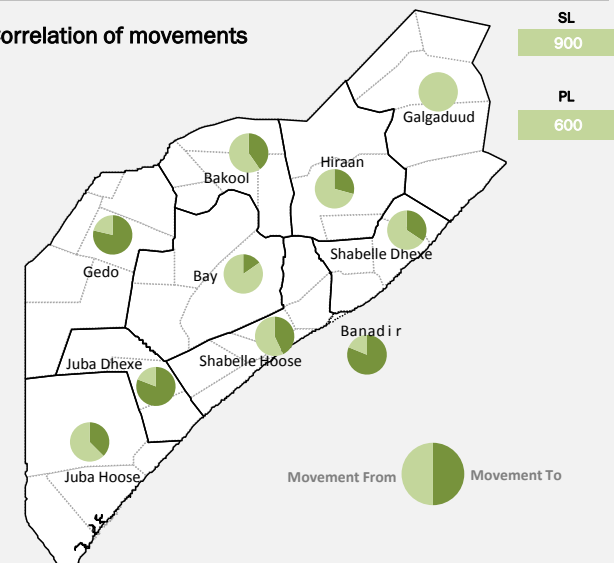

What district did people arrive in?



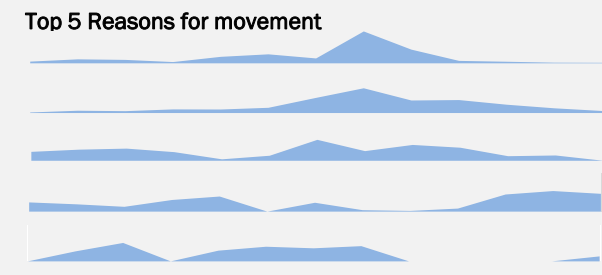

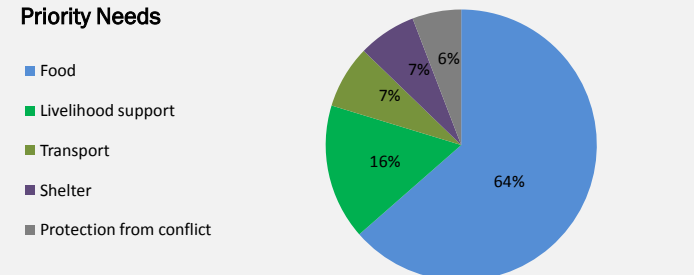

Between 1st Aug and 25th Oct 2012, displacements were mainly recorded in South Central with approximately 37,000 out of a total 39,000 displacements recorded in all three zones. 22,800 displaced people reported insecurity as the major cause of displacement in South Central (mainly in Juba Hoose as a result of the AMISOM/SNAF offensive) followed by Cross border movement (5,000), Lack of livelihood (3,200), IDP temporary return (3,100). The movements originated mainly from Juba Hoose (18,000), Shabelle Hoose (4,200), Gedo (2,400) and Banadir (1,800) regions. The top three regions people moved to were, Juba Hoose (11,000), Gedo (8,800), Banadir (7,700) among other regions.

This data has been collected through the Population Movement Tracking (PMT) system. PMT is designed to capture population movement trends, not cumulative population data. Due to the fluid nature of displacement in Somalia and in order to avoid capturing multiple displacements, UNHCR limits the reporting range to a period of three months - these figures should therefore not be added and used cumulatively.

\* Please note figures have been rounded using a three tier method as follows. Figures below 100 were not rounded at all. Figures between 100 and 1,000 were rounded off to the nearest tenth, figures between 1,000 and 10,000 were rounded off to the nearest hundredth and all figures above 10,000 were rounded off to a thousandth. This rounding rule was applied to the final result after all computations were undertaken.
