



Resolution 2302 (2016)

**Adopted by the Security Council at its 7751st meeting, on
29 July 2016**

The Security Council,

Recalling its previous resolutions 1996 (2011), 2046 (2012), 2057 (2012), 2109 (2013), 2132 (2013), 2155 (2014), 2187 (2014), 2206 (2015), 2223 (2015), 2241 (2015), 2252 (2015) and statements by its President [S/PRST/2014/16](#), [S/PRST/2014/26](#), [S/PRST/2015/9](#), [S/PRST/2016/1](#), and [S/PRST/2016/3](#),

Determining that the situation in South Sudan continues to constitute a threat to international peace and security,

Acting under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations,

1. *Decides* to extend the mandate of the United Nations Mission in the Republic of South Sudan (UNMISS), as set out in resolution 2252 (2015), until 12 August 2016, and *authorizes* UNMISS to use all necessary means to carry out its tasks;

2. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.
