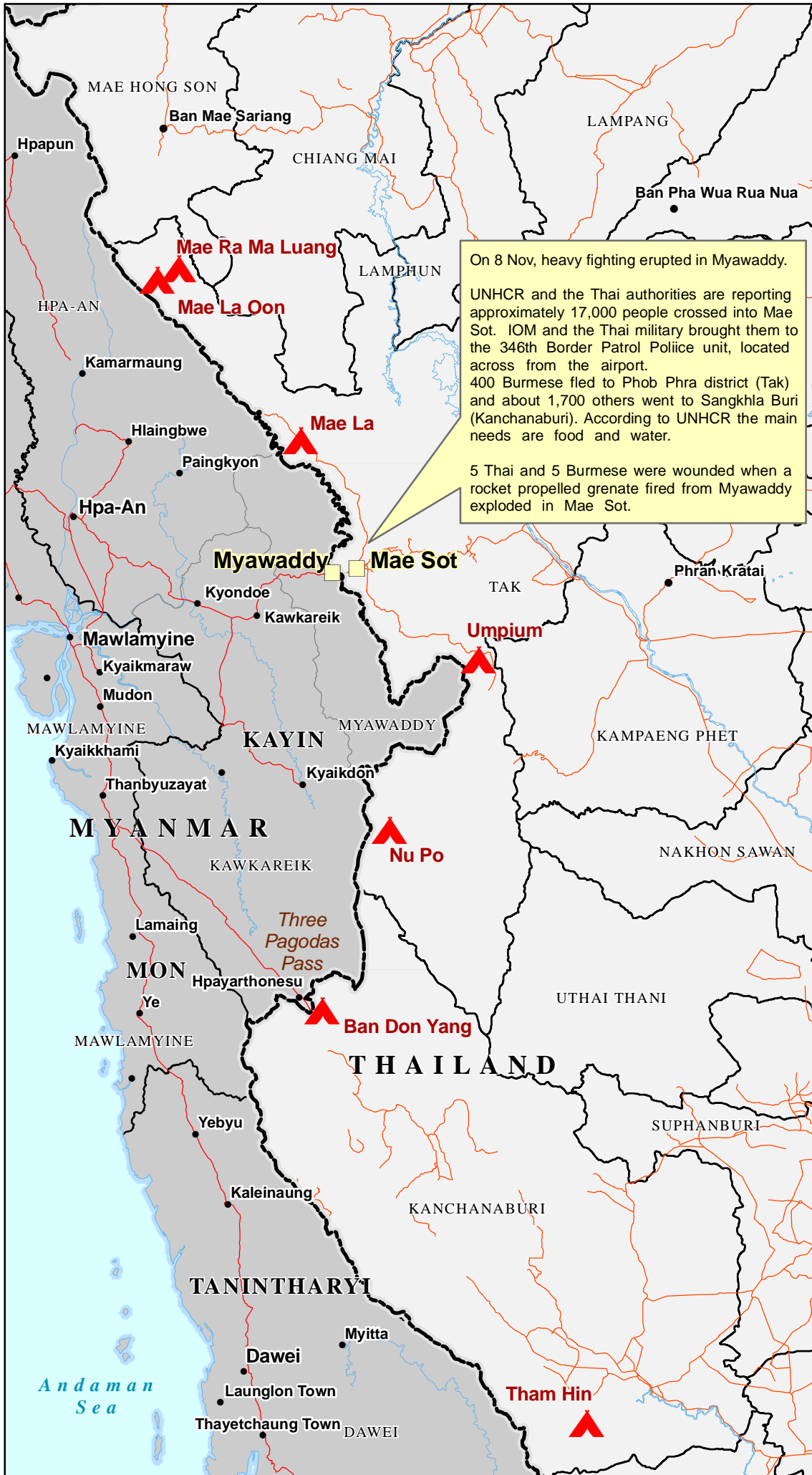


THAILAND: Situation Map

Burmese influx to Mae Sot, as of 9 November, 2010



On 8 Nov, heavy fighting erupted in Myawaddy. UNHCR and the Thai authorities are reporting approximately 17,000 people crossed into Mae Sot. IOM and the Thai military brought them to the 346th Border Patrol Police unit, located across from the airport. 400 Burmese fled to Phob Phra district (Tak) and about 1,700 others went to Sangkhla Buri (Kanchanaburi). According to UNHCR the main needs are food and water.

5 Thai and 5 Burmese were wounded when a rocket propelled grenade fired from Myawaddy exploded in Mae Sot.
