Addendum to the additional report on Japanese implementation of Security Council resolution 1373 (2001)

I. With reference to paragraphs 7 and 47 of the additional report to the Counter-Terrorism Committee pursuant to paragraph 6 of Security Council resolution 1373 (2001) of 28 September 2001, which was submitted by the Government of Japan to the Counter-Terrorism Committee on 1 June 2002, the Government of Japan hereby provides the following information:

On 17 May 2002, the Diet approved the International Convention for the Suppression of the Financing of Terrorism. On 5 June 2002, the Diet passed the legislation which is necessary for implementing the Convention. On 11 June 2002, the Government of Japan deposited the instrument of acceptance of the Convention with the Secretary-General of the United Nations and the Convention entered into force in Japan on 11 July 2002.

II. Regarding paragraphs 39 and 40 of the report, the Government of Japan hereby provides the following information:

On 8 April 2002, Japan and the Republic of Korea signed the Treaty on Extradition between Japan and the Republic of Korea. On 6 June 2002, the instruments of ratification of the Treaty were exchanged. On 21 June 2002, the Treaty entered into force.
