Sent to all licensed financial institutions

The Government of Guyana has undertaken to implement United Nations Security Council resolutions 1333 (2000), 1368 (2001) and 1373 (2001). These resolutions relate substantially to the freezing of all financial assets of terrorists, terrorist organizations, individuals and entities associated with terrorists and their organizations.

Pursuant to the above-mentioned resolutions, licensed financial institutions are hereby instructed to take immediate steps to:

- (a) Identify and freeze all financial assets belonging to terrorists, terrorist organizations and individuals and entities associated with terrorists and their organizations;
- (b) Prohibit payments to and from terrorists, terrorist organizations, individuals and entities associated with terrorists and their organizations;
- (c) Report to the Bank of Guyana within 30 days of the date of this circular, any assets identified as per (a) above;
- (d) Report to the Bank of Guyana promptly any request for payment in relation to (b) above.

In order to assist with the identification of terrorists and terrorist organizations, a current indicative list is attached.*
