

UNHCR operational highlights

- A UNHCR-OCHA mission from Geneva and New York visited Kinshasa, from 10-11 June 2014, for the official roll-out of the new Refugee
 Coordination Model (RCM), which is a result of the joint UNHCR-OCHA Note on Mixed Solutions: Coordination in Practice, in Democratic Republic
 of Congo. The overall goal was to introduce the new RCM, reflect on existing coordination practices and the current interface between refugee and
 IASC coordination, as well as identifying lessons learned and good practices to assist future field application.
- UNHCR organized a national workshop on Refugee Status Determination (RSD) in Goma from 10-12 June 2014. Members of the National
 Commission for Refugees (CNR) participated in this workshop, who were mostly officers working with asylum seekers and members of the Eligibility
 Commission coming Katanga, Kinshasa, North Kivu and South Kivu.
- On 20 June 2014, UNHCR celebrated World Refugee Day. Several awareness raising events and festivities were organized throughout the country.
 In Kinshasa UNHCR organized, amongst others, three training- and awareness sessions on the protection of refugees and IDPs at College de La Salle, the Police's headquarters and at William Booth University.

During the Tripartite Commission meeting held in Kigali on 20-21 June 2013 it was agreed that the DRC Government, with support from UNHCR, would conduct activities among them identification and registration of Rwandan refugees as well as a survey of return intentions. In this context the DRC Government, through the Commission nationale pour les réfugiés (CNR), has been able to identify over 185,000 individuals. Preliminary review of the data collected has shown that 30% of the persons approached by the national authorities have indicated that they intend to return.

Other people of concern

Some 71,755 former Angolan refugees live in DRC, including 23,940 candidates registered for voluntary repatriation and 47,815 candidates who have opted for local integration.



Working with partners

Together with the DRC Government authorities, in particular the National Commission for Refugees (CNR), UNHCR manages and implements humanitarian assistance and protection for refugees, returnees and internally displaced persons. Within the collaborative approach, support is delivered jointly with MONUSCO, WFP, UNICEF, OCHA, UNDP, UNFPA, WHO, FAO, UNHABITAT and IOM among other agencies and NGOs. UNHCR leads the Protection cluster. UNHCR is also the lead of the Protection and Prevention component of the Comprehensive Strategy to Combating SGBV in DRC, under the STAREC.

In the field, assistance is delivered together with 14 implementing partners: ADES, ADSSE, AGIR POUR LE GENRE, AIDES, AIRD, CNR, COOPI, ERUKIN, IEDA, INTERSOS, MIDEFEHOPF, SFCG, TSF and WFWI.



Achievements

- 21,385 DRC refugees returned from the Republic of Congo to Equateur Province since the beginning of this year. The voluntary repatriation operation started on 5 May 2012, since then UNHCR and partners helped 130,230 individuals to return to Equateur.
- UNHCR has organized the voluntary repatriation of 6,241 DRC refugees from the Central African Republic. The operation ended on 5 May 2014.
- By the end of June 2014 the caseload of refugees from the Central African Republic relocated to the 4 camps in Equateur and Oriental provinces has reached 31,506 persons (31,028 in Equateur and 478 in Oriental Province) out of a total of 60,269 refugees.
- Some 2,987 Rwandan refugees returned to Rwanda from Bukavu and Goma with UNHCR's support.
