Law No. 5 of 1991
Implementation of the principles of the Great Green Charter for human rights in the jamahiriya era

General Peoples' Congress

Considering the Great Green Charter for human rights in the jamihiriya era drafted by the Libyan Arab people as inspired by the the First Declaration of the Fateh Revolution in 1969, and in compliance with the contents of the historic declaration of the establishment of the Peoples' authority on the 2nd of March 1977, and the Green Book; humanity's guide towards ultimate libearation from totalitariane rule of individual, class, clan, tribe and party in order to establish a society where all people are free and equal in authority, wealth and arms, and in response to continuous instigation from the natioanal revolutionary Muammar El-Ghaddafi creator of the peoples' era.

In compliance with commitments of the great principles of the Great Green charter of human rights in the jamahiriya era which must be emphasized by the drafting of compatible laws and decisions. In compliance with the decisions made by the Basic Peoples' Congresses during their 2nd regular conference in 1990 which were drafted by the General Peoples' Congress during its 7th regular conference during the period from 11th to 17th June 1991.

The following law was drafted.

Article 1

All legislations prior to the publication of the Great Green Charter for human rights in the jamhiriya era are to be modified in accordance with the principles of this charter. It is prohibited to issue any legislations which are incompatible with these principles.

Article 2

The legislations referred to in article one of this law are to be prepared in a period of one year's time from the publication of this law. This period may be extended to another period or two when necessary following a decision by the General Peoples' Congress.

Article 3

Current legislations which are in force at the time this law is issued remain as such untill they are annulled or modified in accordance with article 1.

Article 4

This law enters into force from the time it is issued and is to be published in the official gazette and through the various media.
