## AN ACT

To provide criminal penalties for smuggling people and trafficking people in accordance with the Republic of Palau's international commitments, including the Nasonini Declaration, the Protocol Against the Smuggling of Migrants by Land, Sea, and Air, and the Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking in Persons, Especially Women and Children, supplementing the United Nations Convention Against Transnational Organized Crime.

## THE PEOPLE OF PALAU REPRESENTED IN THE OLBIIL ERA KELULAU DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1	Sectio	n 1.	<b>Short Title:</b> This Act shall be known and may be cited as the Anti-People
2	Smuggling an	d Trafi	icking Act.
3	Sectio	n 2.	<b>Definitions:</b>
4	(a)	"Chil	d" means a person who is less than 18 years of age.
5	(b)	"Com	mercial carrier" means a company, or the owner, operator or master of any
6		mean	s of transport, any vessel or aircraft, that engages in the transportation of
7		cargo	or passengers for commercial gain.
8	(c)	"Com	pany" means a corporation, partnership, or other entity that is not an
9		indivi	dual.
10	(d)	"Expl	oitation" means sexual servitude, exploitation of another person by and
11		throug	gh prostitution, forced labor or services, or slavery.
12	(e)	"Frau	dulent passport and/or travel or identity document" means a passport, travel
13		and/o	r any other identity document that:
14		(1)	has been made or altered in a material way, by a person other than a person
15			or agency lawfully authorized to make or issue the passport, travel and/or
16			any other identity document on behalf of the country that issued the
17			document; or
18		(2)	has been issued or obtained through misrepresentation, bribery, corruption,
19			duress, or in any other unlawful manner; or
20		(3)	is being improperly used by a person other than the rightful holder.

1	(1)	megal entry means crossing the border of the Republic of Falau of any other	
2		country without complying with the requirements for lawful entry of that country.	
3	(g)	"People smuggling" means arranging or assisting a person's illegal entry into any	
4		country of which the person is not a citizen, including the Republic of Palau, either	
5		knowing or being reckless as to the fact that the person's entry is illegal.	
6	(h)	"People trafficking" means the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring or	
7		receipt of a person for the purposes of exploitation as described in sections 5 or 6.	
8	(i)	"Receiving country" means any country into which a trafficked person is brought as	
9		part of an act of people trafficking.	
10	(j)	"Smuggled person" means any person who is a victim or object of an act of people	
11		smuggling, regardless of whether that person participated in the people smuggling	
12	(k)	"Trafficked person" means any person who is the victim or object of an act of	
13		people trafficking.	
14	Section	n 3. Offense of People Smuggling. Every person who engages in people	
15	smuggling sh	all be guilty of people smuggling regardless of whether the smuggled person arrives	
16	in the receiving country and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than \$25,000, or		
17	imprisoned no	ot more than 10 years or both.	
18	Section	n 4. Offense of Aggravated people Smuggling. Every person who engages in	
19	people smugg	ling under circumstances in which the life or safety of the smuggled person is, or is	
20	likely to be, endangered shall be guilty of aggravated people smuggling regardless of whether the		
21	smuggled per	son arrives in the receiving country, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not	
22	more than \$50	0,000 or imprisoned not more than 15 years or both.	
23	Section	n 5. Offense Relating to Fraudulent Passport, Travel and/or any Other	
24	<b>Identity Doc</b>	uments. Every person who makes, obtains, gives, sells, or possesses a fraudulent	
25	passport, trav	el and/or any other identity document for the purpose of facilitating people smuggling	
26	or facilitating the continued presence of a smuggled person in a receiving country shall be guilty of		
27	travel docume	ent fraud, and upon conviction thereof shall be fine not more than \$25,000, or	

1	imprisoned not more than 10 years or both.		
2	Section 6. Offense of People Trafficking. Every person who knowingly or recklessly		
3	recruits, transport, transfers, harbors or receives any person or persons for the purpose of		
4	exploitation by threat, use of force, abduction, fraud, deception, abuse of power, or the giving or		
5	receiving of payments or benefits to achieve the consent of a person having control over another		
6	person, shall be guilty of people trafficking, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than		
7	\$250,000, or imprisoned not more than 25 years or both.		
8	Section 7. Offense of Trafficking in Children. Every person who knowingly or		
9	recklessly recruits, transports, transfers, harbors or receives a child by any means for the purposes		
10	of exploitation shall be guilty of trafficking in children and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined		
11	not more than \$500,000, or imprisoned for not more than 50 years or both.		
12	Section 8. Offense of Exploiting a Trafficked Person. Every person who knowingly		
13	or recklessly engages in, participates in, or profits from the exploitation of a trafficked person shall		
14	be guilty of exploitation of a trafficked person and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more		
15	than \$50,000, or imprisoned for not more than 10 years or both.		
16	Section 9. Consent of Trafficked Person Irrelevant. For sections 5, 6 and 7 hereof,		
17	it is not defense that the trafficked person consented to the people trafficking or to the exploitation.		
18	Section 10. <u>Immunity of Trafficked Person</u> . A trafficked person shall not be subject		
19	to criminal prosecution with respect to:		
20	(a) The act of people trafficking;		
21	(b) That person's period of unlawful residence in the receiving country; and		
22	(c) That person's procurement or possession of any fraudulent travel or identity		
23	documents which he or she obtained, or with which he or she was supplied, for the		
24	purpose of entering the receiving country; and		
25	(d) That person's illegal entry into the receiving country.		
26	Section 11. Penalty for Non-Citizen.		
27	Every non-citizen convicted under any one of Sections 3,4,5,6, 7 and/or 8 shall have his or		

her entry permit revoked and shall be deported upon completion of any sentence imposed by this						
Section. The Minister of Justice shall promulgate regulations for the deportation of persons pursuant						
to this Act.						
Section	on 12. <u>Scope of Application</u> . The offenses described in sections 2,3,4,5,6 and 7					
hereof apply, regardless of whether the conduct constituting the offense took place inside or outside						
the Republic	the Republic of Palau if:					
(a)	the Republic of Palau is the receiving country or the exploitation occurs in the					
	Republic of Palau;					
(b)	the receiving country is a foreign country but the people smuggling or people					
	trafficking started in the Republic of Palau or transits the Republic of Palau; or					
c)	the person who engages in the people smuggling or people trafficking is a citizen of					
	the Republic of Palau.					
Section	on 13. Obligation of Commercial Carriers. If a commercial carrier carries a					
person into the	he Republic of Palau and, upon entry into the Republic of Palau, the person does not					
have the pass	sport and/or travel documents required for lawful entry, the commercial carrier shall					
be liable to p	ay the costs of the person's detention in, and removal from, the Republic of Palau					
unless:						
(a)	the carrier had reasonable grounds to believe that the documents that the person had					
	were the travel documents required for lawful entry of that person into the Republic					
	of Palau; or					
(b)	the person possessed the passport and/or travel documents required for lawful entry					
	into the Republic of Palau when that person boarded, or last boarded, the means of					
	transport to travel to the Republic of Palau; or					
c)	entry into the Republic of Palau occurred only because of illness of or injury to					
	person on board, stress of weather, or other circumstances beyond the control of the					

commercial carrier.

Section 14. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the President of the Republic of Palau or upon its becoming law without such approval, except as otherwise provided by law.
